PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL.

Extracts from the Minutes, October 23d, 1860.

Petition of numerous merchants and others, praying Council to have a correct census of the City taken at as early a day as possible

Alderman Riggs offered the following resolution, which was adopted:

Resolved, That the Memorial be referred to a committee of three, who shall recommend to Council proper persons to take a complete Census of the City, together with such statistical information as may be necessary to exhibit the condition and prospects of the City, to superintend the management and publication of the same, and to apportion to the several Wards their representation in Council, in conformity to the Act of the General Assembly, passed June 1st, 1838.

The Mayor appointed the following committee, viz: Aldermen Riggs, Edgerton, and Ryan.

Extract from the Minutes, March 26th, 1861.

Alderman Riggs, from the Special Committee, to whom was referred the petition in relation to the City Census, ask leave to report:

That unavoidable circumstances have prevented their earlier attention to this matter, but in sufficient time to ensure its completion for all practical purposes.

Your committee contemplated adopting the plan of dividing the City in sections or squares, and availing themselves of the services of such of our citizens (many of whom kindly offered) who would be willing to take the census of the square or block in which they reside; and in this way it was thought an accurate result would be obtained, and at much saving of expense to the City. But we find, on reflection, that whilst this plan has its advantages, it is not certain that it may not cause delay, and in the result disappoint our expectations, as we would have necessarily to engage the services of some competent person in the end, to compile and arrange the publication of the several returns made under this plan. We have, therefore, deemed it best that this system should not be adopted, but that the work be placed under the supervision of a competent person, to prepare and compile an accurate Census of the City, with such statistical information as, we trust, will meet the wants of the community, and to apportion to the several Wards their proper representation in Council, in conformity to the Act of the General Assembly, passed June 1st, 1838. And in order to ensure this result, your committee recommend that authority be given them to engage the services of Mr. FREDERICK A. FORD, at the sum stated in his communication to the Committee, feeling assured he is fully competent to accomplish the work satisfactorily, which your committee are sanguine will result in exhibiting an increase in population, enterprise and growth, in all the essentials that make up a flourishing community.

The Committee on the City Census are of opinion that the numbering of the houses in the City is rather for the convenience of reference to the residences and places of business of the citizens, than for the purpose of ascertaining the number of houses in the City, which is otherwise more accurately attained; and, consequently, where one house, for instance, has been divided on the ground-floor, in front, into two or more business offices, and the upper part is occupied, perhaps, as a boarding-house or private residence—the parties doing business in the offices below, as well as the person residing or keeping a boarding-house above, are entitled each to a separate reference to these places of business or residence by *their own numbers* respectively. And Mr. FORD, in preparing the City Census, is requested to conform as far as practicable to this principle of numbering.

Alderman Riggs, from the Special Committee, made the following Report, which was concurred in:

The Special Census Committee, empowered by resolution of Council, to have the census taken, and the proper representation in Council apportioned according to the Act of the General Assembly, passed June 1st, 1838, beg leave, respectfully, to report: That in obedience to the resolution referred to, your Committee engaged Frederick A. Ford, Esq., for the purpose, who immediately commenced the work, under the plan agreed upon, and having now finished his labors, has delivered the same in manuscript, ready for publication.

It would scarcely be required in this report to refer in detail to the accuracy, as far as we can judge, attained, as the work will be published as soon as possible, and will, therefore, speak for itself. We have only aimed in the discharge of our duty, to present to the community a correct and reliable census, containing such statistical information as will be of interest, and more especially, to comply with the Act of the General Assembly, requiring a decennial census to be taken for the purpose of giving to the several Wards their proper representation in Council. It will be seen that our City has increased in population, if not in a rapid, certainly in a permanent and prosperous ratio—a result more gratifying than if it were increased by mere numbers, without our orderly, quiet and law-loving people, which we venture to say cannot be surpassed, if equalled, by any city of its size. A fact so encouraging needs no further comment.

Under the present apportionment Council will hereafter be entitled to an increase of two additional Aldermen in the Upper Wards, making in all eighteen; whilst Ward No. 2 will lose one, and Ward No. 4 will gain one, the same number will be preserved in the Lower Wards as heretofore. It is to be hoped that this additional increase in representation will enure to the interest and prosperity of all the Wards, as the City will hereafter not be designated in making tax returns, as before, in Upper and Lower Wards separately, but as a whole, and all sectional differences, if any exists, will thus be obliterated, and the general good, without particular regard to locality, become the paramount motive, whilst a judicious oversight will be observed by the representatives of their several Wards.

Your Committee, in conclusion, find it an agreeable duty to refer to the able and faithful manner in which Mr. Ford has discharged the arduous duties incident to his engagement, and we feel confident that when the work is published and submitted to critical examination, it will not fall short of public expectation; for it will not be forgotten that during the present disturbed state of affairs, difficulties, in many instances, must have arisen, and a generous public will not fail to make the proper allowances.

Mr. Ford's communication, addressed to the Committee, is annexed to this report, and it but remains for us obtain authority to have the work published immediately.

REPORT

ON THE COMPLETION OF THE CENSUS OF 1861.

Charleston, September 20, 1861.

To MESSRS. JOHN S. RIGGS, E. W. EDGERTON and THOMAS RYAN, *Committee on the Census* :

GENTS—Having completed the taking and arrangement of the Decennial Census of the City, I beg leave to report, briefly, that I find the population to be 48,409—a considerable increase over any number heretofore returned. With a view to accuracy, before I commenced my arrangements your opinions as to the principle upon which an enumeration of the houses of the city should be had were requested. The principle prescribed by you for my guidance has been strictly pursued, and the number of every house within the corporate limits correctly ascertained and preserved. Taking every family under the number of the house in which they resided, it was nearly impossible to omit any one, as the omission would at once be apparent on the face of my schedule, in the line devoted to the number of the house. This plan differs from any heretofore adopted, and I have reason to believe has been effectual in my attaining accurately the population of Charleston. The Census having been ordered for the purpose of ascertaining the representation of Aldermen in Council for the ensuing ten years. I procured the written opinion of Judge Pringle as to the law regulating the representation, and the principle upon which the calculation was to be based. I find that by the increase of population and taxation of Ward No. 4, since

the Census taken in 1848, that Ward has become entitled to one additional Alderman, and Ward No. 2 loses one—the other Lower Wards retain their present representation; and Wards No. 5 and 6, by increase of population and taxation, have each become entitled to one additional Alderman. The number, therefore, of Aldermen for the ensuing ten years will be eighteen instead of sixteen, the present number.

I have made out a set of Tables, shewing the construction of the city, the population, with ages and nativity of the whites, and number and ages of the slaves and free persons of color—the population of each street in the city separately, and the present owners and occupants of every house. These tables, with my calculation of the representation in Council, to which the different Wards are entitled, are herewith submitted.

In the report made to the City Council of the Census taken in 1848, the population of the city, as it appears by the United States Census, is brought down to the year 1840. The population as returned for the years 1850 and 1860 (the subsequent decades) appears by the following Tables obtained from the office of the Marshal of the Confederate States for the District of South Carolina, the Census of 1850 having been taken previous to the annexation of the neck to the city, and the Census of 1860 after the annexation.

METEOROLOGY
OF THE
CITY OF CHARLESTON,
FROM 1832 TO 1861.

BY WM. HUTSON FORD, M.D.

Although Meteorology, the *science of the elements*, is unable to furnish a satisfactory explanation of all the elemental disturbances; although the true theory of storms, whirlwinds, water-spouts, the aurora borealis, the *fata morgana*, and of other highly interesting and important phenomena of the air is still unknown: although she cannot predict the states of the weather, as astronomy calculates an eclipse or transit, for want of sufficiently accurate *data*, and from the *apparent* irregularity of meteorological conditions, more principles of wide comprehension have been attained, and the subtle reactions of the sun, air and water are more exactly appreciated, than the world probably imagines. Meteorology is *naturally* an exact science, and even in its present grade of development, calculation is often successfully applied, though frequently inadmissible. In this science, single facts are of less significance than, perhaps, in any other: useful deductions are nearly always drawn from long-continued observations; it deals essentially with averages or *means*, calculated from *maxima* and *minima*. The *extremes* are all that observation affords, and are often inexplicable, since the forces which have caused them to diverge from their *mean* or true expression are either unknown or cannot be measured, though sometimes falling within the

scope of our reasoning, and this even commonly for certain classes of meteorological accidents. The physicist considers himself fortunate even to have reached the general laws in our possession in this obscure branch of knowledge; but the world at large, on the contrary, is impatient to know the immediate causes and effects of changes which cannot escape attention, and which man in many pursuits of life is forced to observe. The problem, generally, is to appreciate the nature and quantity of the forces which cause extremes to diverge, at times, so widely from their real mean—for nature cannot be irregular in meteorology alone. We wish to know why one summer or winter is warmer or colder than another? Why rain is more frequent, the fair weather of longer continuance, the days more windy, the nights calmer, the dew more copious, thunderstorms more frequent in *one* year than in *another*? In what have the conditions varied? The seasons are regular in their sequence; spring, summer, autumn and winter, *never* fail to succeed each other, invested with their special garbs, recognizable in their general characteristics; yet the corresponding seasons of a series of years, in their minor qualities of drought and humidity, of calm or storm, with others included under the term "*weather*," differ so notably as to engage the attention of the most inappreciative, and to affect the transactions of mankind vastly to their advantage or the reverse; sometimes, in fact, even to their entire destruction by famine, flood or otherwise. As each meteorological state, like every other change in nature, depends upon one or more which antecede it and produce it, the whole series could be easily studied and would form a basis for certain prediction, were the influences affecting it limited essentially to the earth and its surface, and the phenomena of any year would exactly correspond with those of the preceding annual series, as we find to occur in astronomy, where the celestial motions are so certain and regular that calculation may reach backward or forward for an unlimited number of revolutions. In meteorology, this is not the case; the narrower but not less important features of

the year are controlled originally by agents in motion, whose progress is yet unstudied; the magnetism of the earth, the influence of the sun and moon opposedly and conjointly, of the rotation of the sun upon his axis and the variation of his spots, are some of these. In some instances we may thus trace the order of succession back to such inappreciable influences, but we are oftener checked by the confusion induced by mere quantitative differences; for in this science *quantity* is always a consideration of high importance—excess of an agent or condition frequently producing an opposite result to that of a moderate intensity. For the *present*, therefore, meteorological prediction is far beyond our reach; our answers must be *conditional*, and our assertions limited to very short periods. Science, in her most sagacious temper, is now grappling with the uncertain influences which lie at the root of meteorological change; we must content ourselves in a restricted field, until the barriers are cast down which naturally limit our scrutiny.

We pass on to a short examination of the meteorological states which are especially active in this city during the warm season, and which have been placed upon record by municipal liberality and foresight. The principal of these are heat, moisture and wind; upon these main divisions hang others which are secondary in character, but to which we shall, nevertheless, devote some attention. The intensity of the sun's rays at any given time and spot upon the surface of the earth, depends:

First, upon the place of the earth in her orbit; and, secondly, upon the sun's actual altitude above the horizon.

On account of the ellipticity of its orbit, the earth is three millions of miles nearer the sun on the first of January, or thereabout, than on the first of July. The increased amount of heat received, due to this approach, according to Sir John Herschell, is no less than one-fifteenth of the whole mean temperature; this fraction being added to the heat of winter, in the northern hemisphere, but subtracted from that of summer; and conversely for the southern

hemisphere. The difference between the mean temperatures of summer and winter due to this cause, is therefore greater in the southern than in the northern half of the globe, and the ancient and still current belief is thus founded on fact, that the world is hotter south of the equator than north of it; only while summer prevails, however—for the southern hemisphere is turned toward the sun when the earth is at its perihelion.

The axis of the earth being inclined to the ecliptic, as the earth revolves in its orbit, the sun appears to travel up and down in the sky, alternately increasing and diminishing in heating power once a year. Four seasons, in the temperate zones, are thus induced, which are of course reverse for the two hemispheres. As the sun mounts and declines, a given surface of the earth receives a varying quantity of heat; more rays impinging upon the surface when the sun is overhead than when it is near the horizon. The following demonstration will explain this assertion and afford us a formula by which to estimate the sun's intensity for any given time:

Let a line, $a b$, be drawn in the meridian, tangent to the earth at a , with its extremity a directed to the pole. Let S be the sun, its rays being assumed parallel at the earth; then a line $S a$ will be parallel to a line $S b$, and the number of rays falling upon the line $a b$ will evidently be measured by a line perpendicular to them between the lines $S a$ and $S b$. Let this perpendicular, therefore, be let fall from the point b upon the line $S a$ at d . Prolong $a b$ to f , and let fall a perpendicular from d upon the line $a f$ at e . The line $d e$ is evidently the sine of the angle $S a f$, which is the sun's meridian altitude, and $d b$ is its tangent. But the line $d b$ we have found to represent the number of rays falling upon the line $a b$, and the square of the line $d b$ would represent the amount of heating rays falling upon the square of the line $a b$; therefore,

The sun's heating power, when on the meridian, varies as the square of the tangent of its altitude.

It is also plain that, the line $a b$ being tangent to the

earth at *a*, and consequently perpendicular to the radius of the spot in question, the angle *S a b* will gradually diminish as the line *a b* is carried farther toward the pole, approaching and finally attaining parallelism with the radius vector; and as the whole amount of the sun's action, in *the yearly mean*, may be considered as derived from that luminary *over the equator*, the mean annual intensity of the sun's rays for any latitude will vary as the *tang.²* of the complement of the latitude. The intensity of the sun diminishes greatly, therefore, from the equator toward the poles, and it is further obvious that the heat of the sun, during its diurnal ascent and decline, will likewise vary as the *tang.²* of its altitude above the horizon.

The calorific power of the sun, *dependent upon altitude* in our hemisphere, is greatest at 12 o'clock on the twenty-second of June, and least on the twenty-second of December. On the twenty-second of June, the northern hemisphere would thus, at first sight, seem to have attained its maximum heat, and the temperature of the earth might be supposed to decrease regularly toward the poles. It is found, nevertheless, that the highest heat is reached, at all latitudes, about the end of July or beginning of August, and at that time the temperature, instead of diminishing from the equator toward the pole, actually varies in the opposite direction—the pole being considerably hotter than the equator itself. This singular effect is owing to the sphericity of the earth, and is due to the *accumulation* of heat. If the earth suddenly ceased to turn upon its axis, a universal conflagration would soon rage upon its illuminated surface, and the ocean would be turned into solid ice upon the other, or dark side. By revolution, the earth's surface successively receives heat, and allows it, at night, to pass off into space. In summer, heat is gradually accumulated, and in winter gradually dissipated. The heat of the earth's surface is consequently determined by the duration of the sun's action, and is measured by the number of hours of sunshine in a day or season, diminished by an opposing number of hours of darkness. The hottest period of the

day is not 12, M., but occurs between 2 and 3, P. M., at equal altitudes of the sun—that surface being most heated which is longest exposed. It is in this way that the varying length of days, at different seasons and latitudes, modifies the influence of the angle of insolation. When the sun is north of the equator, the days are longer than the nights, but shorter in the southern hemisphere; and when the sun is south, the reverse obtains—the days being in each case progressively longer toward the pole on that side of the equator upon which the sun may be, but progressively shorter on the other side. The following figures, from Espy and Prof. Henry, show the coincidence between the length of the day and the temperature, for the ascending latitudes:

The diminution of the sun's intensity, owing to low altitude, is counterbalanced by increase in length of the days; the resulting temperature, as we see by the figures, singularly rising as we approach the pole. This is an effect of the earth's spheroidal figure. Were this cylindrical, the days and nights would be uniformly of equal length, and equatorial temperatures and seasons prevail in all latitudes. As it is, the extremes of temperature diverge as we advance north or south from the equator; the winter becomes colder and the summer hotter. A natural provision exists for the exaltation of animal and vegetable life; what is

accomplished is sooner done; the season of growth and reproduction is shorter, and, by compensation, more intense. At Bogota, $4^{\circ}35'$ N. L., the difference of temperature between the hottest and coldest *month* is only 3° Fahr.; in the City of Mexico ($19^{\circ}25'$ N. L.) this difference is 14° ; in Paris ($48^{\circ}50'$) it is 48° ; and, in St. Petersburg, 57° . As we progress northward or southward, the difference between the extreme length of the days and the extreme temperatures of summer and winter regularly increase—little such variation occurring at the equator. In the United States, about the middle of July, the temperature of the Cities of New York and Boston, and, in Canada, of Quebec and Montreal, is greater than that of Charleston or of the equator.

After the summer solstice, although the days are shortening in consequence of the sun's recession, their diminution is for some time scarcely perceptible, and as the days are still much longer than the nights, more heat is imparted to the earth than is lost by night-radiation. The temperature thus continues to rise; the augmentation ceasing as soon as the quantity of heat gained is entirely given off during a longer night, when the acme of temperature is reached, and the earth soon begins to cool. Conversely, the earth does not attain its lowest temperature until a corresponding period after the winter solstice, when the sun has for some time been again advancing toward the pole. The greatest heat is reached in Charleston about the end of July, the thermometer then showing 81° as the mean for a series of years; at the same time the temperature of Jacksonville, Florida, is $88^{\circ}5'$; of Philadelphia, $90^{\circ}4'$; of the upper part of Newfoundland, $89^{\circ}5'$; of the southernmost point of Greenland, $88^{\circ}4'$; at Baffin Bay, $90^{\circ}8'$; and at the pole, by calculation, 96° ; while at the equator, it is as low as 72° .

Inequalities of the earth's surface, the neighborhood of oceans, lakes or rivers, and, no doubt, astronomical conditions also, the trade-winds and ocean currents, exert a notable influence upon temperature and the seasonal acme

of heat for any given place. So active, in fact, are these perturbing forces, that although it is possible upon the basis of the equatorial mean temperature to calculate the mean temperature of every spot of the earth's surface, this calculated temperature is never found to coincide with that obtained by observation. And for similar reasons, this *observed* mean temperature differs for different localities, even in the same city or part of the country.

Below we give a table of mean temperatures for the City of Charleston :

It will be observed that the temperature begins to rise in February, reaches its highest point in July, descends slowly in the two following months, but rapidly in the latter part of October; the coldest and hottest months being those which follow the solstices. The march of the temperature is well exhibited by an iconographic table and curve based upon the preceding data. The mean temperature of the City of Charleston for the whole year, from the above table, is 65.93; that of Charleston harbor (lat. $32^{\circ} 42'$), (Tnomey's Geo. Rep.), 64.31; of Madeira in about the same latitude ($32^{\circ} 37'$), 64.56; of Rome (lat. $41^{\circ} 54'$), 60.70; of Paris (lat. $48^{\circ} 50'$), 51.50; and of Augusta, in the State of Georgia (lat. $33^{\circ} 28'$), 65.24.

The conditions which affect an increase or diminution of the temperature of the earth's surface, independently of the main astronomical agencies, in successive years, at the same spot, are mainly the *fairness of the sky, the density of building and shallowness of the soil, the humidity of the air, and the prevalence of certain winds.*

The surface of the earth is heated proportionately to the fairness or cloudiness of the sky. The coolness of night is due to the shadow of the earth itself; twilight is cooler than broad-day, and a cloudy day is cooler than a bright or *fair* day, in consequence of the veil which is interposed between the sun's beams and the soil; *ceteris paribus*, the heat of the earth will be found to vary as the number of fair days in a month or season.

The *fairness or serenity* of the sky may be approximately estimated by observation; with much accuracy by means of photographic sensitive paper, by a record of the number of fair days and by the barometer. In this city no special record indicates, with accuracy, the degree of fairness or cloudiness of a day; great natural variations obtain in these qualities, which should be accurately expressed in figures. In the absence, however, of proper data, we must base our remarks upon such as are in our possession from the city records, which relate only to the period of day-

light. The aspect of *the night* is not noted. In our registrations, a day is recorded "fair" when clouds have not been observed during the whole or the greater part of it: all "*fair*" days are assumed, although this is quite contrary to fact, to be equal in light and heat. A "cloudy" day is one upon which the surface has been *wholly* or *mostly* shaded: no record being given of the degree of *opacity* of the clouds, or of the number of hours of day and night during which the sky is covered; and a "*rainy*" day is one upon which *rain* is precipitated in great or small quantity; no mention of the duration of the rain, or the fairness or cloudiness of the rest of the day being made. These facts should be ascertained by accurate instruments, and published in the annual abstract.

Contenting ourselves with the only attainable record—that by simple observation—with regard to the cloudy days, we must pursue a middle course. If a fair day permits the full influence of the sun, while a *rainy* day, which is supposed to be cloudy also, almost neutralizes that influence, then a cloudy day, so called, would occupy an intermediate position, being in fact neutral, between a fair and rainy day. This will appear just if we reflect that in our climate there are but few days in winter or summer which are entirely cloudy, upon which rain does not fall within the twenty-four hours; if there be no rain, the sun is equally apt to make *his* appearance. In an estimate of the fairness of the sky, we must, therefore, consider *one half* of the cloudy days as *fair days*, and the rest as *rainy days*, and should an entire day be included in a category which belongs in strictness only to a part of it, scarcely any effect can be evident in a mean which is deduced from several thousand observations. Our records in this respect, and with the above qualifications, extending through a long series of years, may be regarded as closely indicative of the aspect of the sky. We append the following table:

October is our fairest month: August the least fair of the summer months. We also present a table in which the moiety of the cloudy days is not added to the sum of the fair days, that their influence may be separately observed.

August is the least cloudy month of the year; and since it is also the least fair, more rainy days occur in this month than in any other: in August, rain almost always falls upon a cloudy day. *Fairness* inducing a notable augmentation in the proper temperature of a month, the remarkable fairness of October, with us, explains that gentle diminution of the heat which is frequently perceptible

only in the increasing coolness of the nights. The *mean fairness*, it will be perceived from the foregoing tables, regularly increases, if the mean be deduced from a *series of years*, from July until November. The regular fall of temperature, dependent upon increased length of the nights, is thereby counterbalanced, to a certain extent, and the real temperature remains for a long time stationary, or sinks slowly. This law belongs, however, to the mean of many years, each season exhibiting a progression which varies more or less according to the power of collateral agencies. In certain years the fairness regularly increases, the season is retarded, the mean temperature sinks gradually, and frost falls late. At other times the progression is stationary, or even reverse, the season is interrupted, or may become more and more unfair, the mean temperature will fall quickly or even suddenly, and frost may be looked for early. Thus, in 1854, the number of fair days successively increased in August, September and October, and the temperature, therefore, continued above its mean.

The barometer likewise enables us to estimate the fairness or serenity of the sky. According to Müller "a high barometer signifies clear weather for all places where the warm winds bring rain, while a gradual fall of the mercury indicates rainy weather." We give below a table of barometrical maxima from the registrations of this city.

From the record of the fair days, August is the least fair month of the year, and October the fairest of the summer months; and from July until the close of the year each month becomes successively fairer: a progression probably dependent upon changes advancing under the equator, and influencing our climate by the prevalence of certain winds of the return currents from the north-east, as we shall show hereafter. The cause of these barometrical oscillations resides in the changes of specific gravity, induced in the atmosphere through the agency of the watery vapor it holds in solution. When the barometer is high, the weight of the aerial column is increased, and conversely; a column of air, in proportion to its impregnation with aqueous vapor in *true solution*, or *as vapor* and unprecipitated, being able to outweigh variable columns of mercury. It is principally by the reduction of this aqueous *vapor* to the liquid state, *in the clouds*, that these changes in the specific gravity of the air are produced. The clouds, which are masses of minute, hollow globules of water, are principally held aloft by electrical repulsion from the earth and sea: in this state, no pressure is exerted by them upon the mercury, as they are sustained by a force which neutralizes gravity. When, however, these liquid particles become dissolved by the air, they necessarily add their weight to that of the aerial column, without, however, increasing its *bulk*: as the heavens clear the clouds are dissolved, the air becomes heavier, and the mercury rises. So, likewise, in

the *formation of clouds*, the air loses in weight, and the barometer falls; the precipitated vapor, if very abundant, cohering into globules and drops of rain; if in less quantity, remaining above by the electrical force of the earth; in neither case is their weight felt by the barometer. That the mercury should be so notably affected by these influences does not appear surprising when we consider the huge banks of clouds piled upon each other at certain times, all of which is eventually redissolved or thrown down as rain, being not merely blown away, according to a popular idea; and also, that at the earth's surface and at ordinary temperatures, a cubic foot of air may take up from six to ten grains of watery vapor. For a *series* of years, for seasons or months, therefore, the barometrical records afford a correct indicator of the serenity of the sky.

While fairness of the *days* favors the acquisition of heat, fairness of the *nights* exerts an opposite influence of considerable intensity. The air is heated by terrestrial surfaces, being unable to receive heat directly from the sun to any appreciable extent, and is consequently cooler than the soil in the day-time. The difference between the air and soil temperature is at times very wide. Under the tropic of Capricorn, at the Cape of Good Hope, in Australia, in the interior of South America, about the first of January, when the greatest altitude of the sun for the southern hemisphere coincides with the earth's perihelion, the temperature of the *earth's surface* sometimes rises to 140 or 150 degrees; even the air, however, may attain nearly as high a heat in certain places—as in Egypt and Palestine, when the wind blows over wide tracts of parched desert. Whatever heat is received by the earth during the day is returned at night. In our latitude, the temperature having steadily risen from sunrise, in virtue of this return, radiation begins to decline at three or four o'clock, p. m., and gradually falls until the next sunrise. The air cannot intercept these escaping rays; they are launched into space and forever lost to our planet.

Nocturnal radiation is much controlled by meteorological

conditions. If the sky is unobstructed by clouds, diminution of temperature is rapid, the surface-stratum of air is soon cooled to its point of hygrometric saturation, and aqueous vapor is deposited in the form of *dew*, which may remain liquid, or be afterward frozen, constituting *hoar-frost*. Since contact is requisite in this deposition of moisture, dew will be most abundantly formed, when, besides a clear sky, a scarcely perceptible motion exists in the air; new portions of air are thus in succession brought into contact with the cooling surface, and a greater precipitation is affected upon a given area of soil. Dew is deposited upon bodies in a direct ratio to their power of radiating caloric: the best radiators are soonest moistened, and it is interesting to note that organic substances and plants are endowed with superior capacities in this respect.

When the night is cloudy, the greater part of the caloric radiated by the earth is returned from the clouds; cooling is arrested, or goes on but slowly, and no dew is formed. Cloudy nights are warm both in winter and in summer, and *impede* the *cooling* of the earth, while cloudy *days* prevent its *heating*; and since "*fair days*" facilitate the heating of the soil, the earth must be warmer upon a cloudy night, preceded by a fair day, than upon a cloudy night ensuing upon a cloudy or rainy day, or upon a fair night ensuing upon a fair or cloudy day. To produce a maximum of soil heat at night, free access must exist for the sun's rays during daylight; and as soon as the earth begins to cool in the afternoon, the sky should be veiled and the acquired caloric prevented from passing off. This conjunction of circumstances is of frequent occurrence in our city during the months of August, September and October.

If the sun's rays be shut off by the foliage of trees, the effect is similar: the earth is not so much heated by day, and is less easily cooled by night; a grateful shade protects the surface from extremes both of heat and cold.

Buildings, likewise, especially in cities, act in an analogous manner. As on cloudy nights much of the heat radiated from the earth is returned by the clouds, so also in

cities, thermal rays which part at certain angles from the surface impinge against walls, the sides of houses, porticoes and piazzas, and after several reflections are, in great part, returned to the earth. Radiation is always obstructed in cities to such an extent, that the soil of a densely-built town, even on a fair night, resembles that of the open fields upon a *cloudy night*. The temperature of the earth never falls so low within the city, where nocturnal heat-radiation is obstructed, as in the country, where it is unlimited. The mean nightly temperature of the soil is, therefore, least in the open field beneath a clear sky; next, greater in the open field under a cloudy sky; greater, still, in the courts, streets and yards of a city under a *clear sky*; and greatest of all, in these *latter* places, upon a cloudy night succeeding a fair day. Under circumstances like these last the temperature of the soil can fall but little, and if building is very dense, becomes almost *seasonal*, like that of *vaults* and cellars. Cities are well known to be warmer both by day and night, in winter as well as in summer, than the surrounding country. Hoar-frost consequently occurs, first, in the open field upon the withering herbage; next, upon lots filled with *vegetable matter* on the outskirts of a city, in pasture grounds, or *extensive* gardens, and within the town only when the season is well advanced; and with us but seldom even throughout the winter.

The action of the sun's rays upon the soil is likewise influenced by the *humidity of the air*. From a moist soil, in a dry air, evaporation is rapid; the sensible heat of the surface is abstracted in the volatilization of the emitted aqueous vapor, and the sun's heating power is proportionately diminished. As the humidity of the air increases, on the other hand, by so much is the cooling process of vaporization retarded, and the sun's heat retained. Moisture of the air, therefore, inasmuch as it retards evaporation, favors the retention of soil-heat; it, moreover, produces the same effect in an independent manner. The caloric rays given off from the earth are of less *penetrative intensity* than those directly from the sun—they pass less readily through a

humid atmosphere, although with great facility through dry air; a fact illustrated in the mode practised in Bengal, of fabricating ice at night, by the exposure of water in shallow pans to the clear sky, the air being at the same time very dry. When, therefore, the air is humid, the earth parts at night less readily with its caloric, is not so quickly cooled, and a higher range of temperature is maintained until morning. If, again, the soil be dry, and the temperature elevated, a moist atmosphere causes a precipitation of dew early in the evening—this *early* dew being of course warmer than that of other nights. A moist atmosphere thus increases the heat of the soil by obstructing diurnal and nocturnal radiation; it preserves acquired heat by preventing evaporation from a moist soil, and causes a deposition of earlier and warmer dew upon a dry soil.

Humidity of the air varies with the temperature; practically, water being abundantly dispersed, the *amount of watery vapor which the air contains depends mostly upon the temperature of the air*. The quantity of vapor in the air ranges from $\frac{1}{40}$ th of the weight of the air, at 32° Fahrenheit, to $\frac{1}{8}$ th at 80° and upward. Vapors are given off from the surfaces of liquids at temperatures much below their boiling points, and pass off both in the air and in *vacuo* more rapidly as the aërial pressure is less and the temperature higher, either of their own mass or of the surrounding atmosphere. From watery surfaces vapor is constantly emitted with a rapidity indicative of the elastic force of the vapor at different temperatures and barometric pressures. If the air contains but little watery vapor, what passes into it will be quickly dissolved: if it contains much, or if it be *saturated for that temperature*, the vapor remains undissolved, and appears as mist: hence it is that the breath is visible in a very damp atmosphere, even when the air is comparatively warm. If the temperature of the air be still higher its solvent power will be still further increased, and more aqueous vapor can be taken up invisibly from a watery or humid surface. If, on the other hand, the air be cold, vapor, which rises from heated liquids, from the

breath, from the surface of banks, fields, or bodies of water, upon which the morning or evening sun is shining, will not be dissolved, but will appear as mist. Hence the *emission* of watery vapor into the air and its dissolution are separate phenomena, related to each other, but not necessarily connected.

Since the solution of aqueous vapor depends ultimately upon the temperature of the air at any given spot, greater humidity should exist as the temperature is greater. The sun heats the surface-moisture, increasing the evolution of vapor, at the same time imparting a higher temperature to the superjacent air, by which its solvent power is enhanced, from which it results that as the temperature of a month or season increases so also will the amount of vapor or *humidity*.

The degree of humidity of the air is advantageously estimated by observing "the highest temperature at which the moisture in the air will be condensed upon any cold body;" this temperature is termed the dew-point. The dew-point, in the open air, and for moderate periods of time, that the disturbing influences of winds may balance each other, will, therefore, from all accurate records, be found to advance as theory demands—like the barometrical maxima, indicating the march of the temperature. Müller states that the absolute quantity of water in the air is, like the mean temperature of the air, greatest in July and least in January (for Germany), and of the *diurnal* variation of the dew-point, which is also *inherently* controlled by the above laws of the extrication of vapor and its reception into the atmosphere. Espy observes: "It has been ascertained by experiment that the quantity of vapor in the air is increased as the temperature rises with the ascent of the sun. This, however, lasts only until nine o'clock, when an ascending current of air, occasioned by strong heating of the surface of the ground, carries the vapor on high; so that the water contained in the lower stratum of the atmosphere diminishes, although the formation of vapor continues with the increase of the heat; this diminution is

apparent until four o'clock, when the quantity of water in the lower strata of the air again increases, because the upwardly-directed currents of air cease to carry away the vapor formed: this increases but until nine. P. M., only, or thereabout, because the decreasing temperature of the air puts a limit to the further formation of vapor," more properly, "the decreasing temperature of the soil:" for as dew is soon formed after nightfall under a clear sky, it is obvious that the emission of vapor and its solution in the air must have ceased some time before.

The dew-point varies in the same direction as the temperature of the *air* depends upon it, but nevertheless does not progress directly with it.

Thus, at 32° Fahr., the elastic force of aqueous vapor is 0.200 (inches of mercury), and the air may contain 0.004166 per cent., by weight, of aqueous vapor.

Also, at 70° Fahr., the elastic force of aqueous vapor is 0.721 (inches of mercury), and the air may contain 0.01515 per cent., by weight, of aqueous vapor.

Again, at 80° Fahr., the elastic force of aqueous vapor is 1.000 (inches of mercury), and the air may contain 0.02089 per cent., by weight, of aqueous vapor.

By the proportion, therefore, which follows, the difference of temperature between 70° and 80°, or 10° Fahr., is to the difference between 32° and 80°, or 48° Fahr., as 29.80 is to 100.

The difference of elastic force between 70° and 80°, or its *range* between those points = 0.279 (inches), is to the difference of elastic force, between 32° and 80°, or its range between those points = 0.800 (inches), as 34.87 is to 100.

The difference of saturative weight of vapor between 70° and 80°, or its range between those points = 0.005682 (inches), is to the difference of saturative weight of vapor, between 32° and 80°, or its range between these points = 0.01669 (inches), as 29.34 is to 100.

But 29.80 is about one-fifth of one hundred, so that while the thermometer ranges through 29.80 per cent. of its entire range, the elastic force ranges through 34.87 per cent. of

its entire range, and the saturative weight of vapor, through 29.34 per cent. of its whole range. If now, since the dew-point is controlled by the tension of the aqueous vapor, and by the quantity of vapor held in solution at different temperatures, we assume as the range of the dew-point, the mean of the ranges of the elastic force and saturative weight, for the ten degrees between 70° and 80° Fahr., we find that the range of the dew-point is 32.10 per cent. of its whole range from 32° to 80°—that of the temperature being only 20.80 per cent. of its whole range between the same thermometric points. It results, therefore, that when the thermometer, in very moist weather (theoretically saturated), by a seasonal advance, sinks through ten degrees of the scale, the dew-point will, at the same time, sink through 15.4 of the scale.

It follows, therefore, *that the annual or seasonal range of the dew-point is greater than the annual or seasonal range of the thermometer, and this difference of range proves for the spot where it is observed that the dew-point of that place is influenced by the temperature of that place.*

We will now proceed to examine the dew-point, as recorded in this city, being taken at sunrise, and to observe whether the conditions required by theory are fulfilled from these registrations. We append the following table:

Both minima occur in January, both maxima in July; and the increase and decrease in both series is quite similar. A parallelism manifestly exists throughout, which we shall further show to be a *real dependence* by a consideration of the annual *ranges* of these records. We subjoin a com-

parison of these figures for all the years in which the dew-point has been recorded:

As we expected to find, the dew-point range is almost invariably greater than that of the thermometer; this is also evident upon an inspection of the means.

Similar results are obtained by a comparison of the means of the three summer months; thus we give

The maxima of temperature coincide with the maxima of the dew-point, and so also for the minima. The thermometrical range is 3.82°; that of the dew-point 5.98°.

The humidity of our city is thus influenced by its heat for years and seasons; this is true likewise for months.

In 1860 both minima occurred in Dec.; both maxima in July.

July and August of this year (1851) scarcely differ in temperature or in the dew-point, the temperature of July being 81.89, and its dew-point 74.38; the temperature of August being 81.21, and its dew-point 74.69.

In 1850 both minima occur in Feb.; both maxima in July.
 In 1849 “ “ Feb.; the maximum temperature occurs in August, and the highest dew-point occurs in July, which is, however, but three-quarters of a degree greater than that of August—the usual monthly difference between the dew-points of two adjacent summer months being *five or six degrees*.

In 1848 both minima occur in January; the highest dew-points and temperatures occur in July and August.

In 1847 both maxima occur in August; the minima in December and February.

In 1846 both minima occur in Jan.; both maxima in Aug.

In 1845 “ “ Dec.; “ “ July.

In the great majority of instances both maxima or minima occur in the same months, although these months are by no means the same for every year; and when, exceptionally, they occur in different months, these months are generally of nearly the same intensity.

Humidity implies *heat*; much which has been attributed to this quality is strictly referable to the *heat* that accompanies and induces it.

We therefore regard it as established, generally and for this city, that the dew-point is controlled by the temperature, and that the range of the dew-point is simultaneously greater than the range of the thermometer, in consequence of the influence of heat upon the humidity of the air.

We pass on to an examination of “moisture of the surface,” or *rain*. More rain falls in summer than in winter: this will be evident from an inspection of the following tables. To show the *intensity* of showers, we give:

Upon *one rainy day*, most rain falls in September and least in April. April showers are proverbially light. Conjointly, August, September and October are characterized by a *greater intensity of rain*, than any other period of three months in the year; and in August and September, conjointly, the *actual* amount of rain which falls upon an average is also as great as that for any other three months of the year. This will be seen from the following table :

The weather, therefore, of August and September is characterized by fairness, heat and heavy rains. We have already found that in August it is seldom cloudy without rain.

The dew-point bears no relation to the depth of rain-fall, although excessive humidity of the air is closely connected with the occurrence of rain at certain seasons; but no measurable connection of the dampness of the air from *surface-absorbed moisture*, with the *temperature*, upon which rain depends, of the higher atmospheric regions, can be reasonably supposed to exist. As regards our city records, after diligent search, we are entirely unable to perceive any ratio between the dew-point and the number of inches of rain for days, months or seasons. The stratum of air in contact with the earth does not follow the hygrometric variations of the upper atmosphere; were it so, we should be frequently enveloped in fog, and would be exposed, like those who live upon a high mountain, to wide and sudden changes of temperature. The majestic oscillations of the sky are, for the most part, imperceptible at the earth's surface. The lower air strata, in temperate climates, are scarcely

ever saturated with moisture. If rain falls, it is soon re-dissolved from the earth, and during the heaviest showers the air is really transparent, no fog or mist remaining, most frequently, after the rain ceases; while at the same time great masses of cloud above attest the entire saturation of the strata in which they float, and whence the rain has proceeded. The air above is always nearer its saturation point than that below, when the earth is *warm*, and *conversely*. Upon a summer's day the brilliant cloud-banks, termed *cirrus*, indicate that the air at that elevation and temperature is saturated with moisture; these clouds are formed *each day* from vapor drawn from the earth. As the warm and moist current rises from the surface, it expands in bulk, and falls in temperature; and upon reaching an altitude controlled by its temperature at the surface, and its proper humidity, precipitation of a portion of its vapor occurs, and cloud is formed. These accumulations in the months of August and September, generally make their appearance about eleven o'clock, A. M., and increasing toward afternoon, frequently break up in a thunder storm; their height above the earth may be calculated from the dew-point temperature.

The *upward diurnal currents* next claim our attention.

Most transparent media allow a free passage not only to the white light of the sun, but also to its actinic and heating rays. The sun has no appreciable effect in warming the air; unlike rays emitted from terrestrial bodies, whether by reflection or radiation, the sun's rays possess a *tension* or penetrative power, in virtue of which they pass through diaphanous substances without heating them. A plate of glass, which permits the sun's rays to traverse it, but remains cold, must attain a certain temperature before it gives passage to the radiated heat of a common fire. The temperature of the air consequently depends upon that of the earth's surface, and of the bodies upon it: the atmosphere is heated by caloric applied to its lowest strata, and, like liquids, as shown by Count Rumford, can *only be warmed* from below. A continual upward projection of the lower

and warmer strata, by colder and heavier ones above, brings fresh masses in contact with the heating surface. Notwithstanding the common assertion, that air heated at the earth's surface rises only until it enters a stratum in *thermal equilibrium* with itself, it is demonstrable that every surface-heated stratum tends to rise to the highest regions of the aerial ocean, and would do so were its mass unbroken by winds or the force of gaseous diffusion. Thus, the density of the air diminishes as we ascend, by a fixed ratio, with a corresponding fall of temperature. At all elevations, the ratio between the density and temperature of an air-stratum is constant; for, should a volume of the cold, attenuated air of the highest stratum be brought down to the earth, it would gradually diminish in bulk, with a steady rise of temperature, until finally, upon the earth's surface, its temperature and density would be found to equal those of the air around; it would have no tendency to rise or to sink, but would, if *carried upward*, resume its former low temperature and expanded bulk. While at the earth, however, should the least amount of heat be imparted to it, if prevented from mingling with adjacent masses, it would rise to the very highest regions, or surface (if there be such a termination) of the atmosphere; for, at any point of its upward progress it would be *equally* buoyant with the air around, in consequence of expansion from diminution of pressure; it would likewise possess the same temperature, in consequence of its equal density; it would, however, be of greater temperature, in consequence of the heat imparted to it, and of less density than the air around; it must, therefore, rise, and so throughout, for every point of its ascent. By the upward currents, the whole aerial mass is constantly commingled, and a mean atmospheric purity eventually attained. Whenever the sun's rays fall upon the earth, in its usual state of comparative dryness, the surface-layers of air are soon heated, and perpetually stream upward. Throughout the day, these ascending currents are in motion, their place being filled by lateral supplies of cooler air from the water, the sides of moun-

tains, forests, or sections of country *over which clouds may float*. At no successive instants, during a bright day, after the earth has once been warmed to the temperature of the night air of the previous night, do the same particles touch the surface; an unremitting renewal of the surface air-stratum is in continual progress as long as the heat of the soil or terrestrial surface is greater than that of the air in contact with it. The ascending currents are generally established about an hour after sunrise, and cease a little after sunset: these limits are much influenced by season, temperature and dryness of the soil or other surfaces.

The ascending currents belong strictly to the diurnal system: they do not exist at night. After sunset, if the sky be clear, the earth is rapidly cooled, its temperature sinks below that of the superincumbent air, and motion can no longer be communicated to the surface-stratum of the atmosphere, for heat is not now imparted to it. At night, therefore, there is no upward current, nor, on the other hand, is there a downward current: for as the air above does not lose heat by radiation to any appreciable extent it remains at rest, and should the surface-stratum be cooled ever so much, it is thereby rendered heavier and still more immovable. Upon a flat surface the night air consequently rests unmoved, but if the surface be inclined it rolls down as from the sides of mountains, or sinks from the perpendicular surfaces of trees, rocks or buildings, to diffuse itself uniformly over a level surface, or to fall to the lower levels of valleys, swamps or rivers. For *level surfaces, however, like those of most cities, upon a calm night, the stratum of air which was in contact with the earth near or after sunset remains unmoved until the following morning*. The stillness peculiar to the air at night is well illustrated by the motions of mists and smoke. Upon a cold morning, when all exposed objects are coated with hoar-frost after a clear night, the air *before* sunrise is transparent, and no mist is seen; as soon, however, as the sun rises and acquires sufficient heat, mist is observed to rise into the air from all frosty surfaces upon which the sun shines, and soon begins to move slowly upward in the ascending currents.

When cool air flows over a warm and damp soil, as over marshes or swampy places, the vapor given off from them is condensed during the night, and a mist is formed which hangs motionless upon the earth during the entire night or is slowly diffused over neighboring spots; but when the rays of the sun have somewhat heated the soil beneath the entire mass is frequently seen to move upward, at the same time the air beneath being quite transparent. This striking exhibition we have often noticed in the extended rice fields of this State. Mists are similarly formed upon the surface of rivers or other collections of water; they are last influenced by the morning's sun; after the misty veil has been completely withdrawn from the face of the earth, the course of the river, or outline of the bay, is clearly designated by the vapory mass.

Smoke, from a tall chimney, is seen during the day to rise obliquely and finally to mingle with the clouds; on the contrary, in the early morning, before the ascending currents are established, it rests nearly in the same stratum in which it is given off, and if there be no wind, or only a gentle sidelong current, it can be traced for miles at exactly the same distance above the earth, except when it meets a forest, when it rises just high enough to pass over the summits of the trees. This is owing to the higher night temperature of the woodland over the surrounding open country. The smoke of a fire built upon a vessel in the centre of a body of water, in the still morning air, rises gently to a certain height, then sinks upon the water and flows off, if there be any current, in direct contact with the aqueous surface. So, likewise, for *steam* in a humid atmosphere. The smoke of a cigar is wafted upward, during the day, at the rate of several feet in a second; but, at night, if there be no wind, remains where it was emitted, or even sinks slowly toward the soil. Not only does the sense of sight furnish proofs of the mobility of the diurnal air and the calmness of the earth-stratum at night, but likewise the sense of smell. Effluvia of all sorts are nearly imperceptible in the day-time, but accumulate in great intensity at

night, if there be no wind. The "scent" of wild animals, which is sometimes given off by the breath and surface of the body, and sometimes from special glands, in the language of the hunter, "lies" best at night and in the calm morning which succeeds a fair, frosty night. Most animals, especially if they depend upon the sense of smell, follow their prey at night. Animal odors may be perceived at night for marvellous distances; the scent of the *skunk* (*Meplutis Americana*) is offensive even to human senses for a mile or two, in the direction of the wind, from the spot where the animal has been worried or killed. We all know that the perfume of flowers is especially intense after dark; in most cases, odors are given off in equal quantity during the day, but are lost in the ascending currents: at night, however, they accumulate in the surface-air. The same is also true of that host of offensive and noxious smells liberated from the surfaces of cities, and the various foci which abound wherever men congregate: they are imperceptible during the hours of sunshine, but become eminently disagreeable soon after nightfall, and are especially abominable and dangerous before sunrise: so likewise for the musty and offensive emanations of ponds, marshes and swamps in the country, which are not noticeable or dangerous in the day, but become most so at night, and in the morning—in the phraseology of the countryman, "before the dew is off the ground"—dew must, of course, be evaporated almost entirely before the upward currents can be actively established.

Besides, the diurnal "upward currents," lateral currents, or winds, are of great importance with respect to the various conditions of humidity and heat of the air and of the earth's surface. Winds vary in direction and force: their *direction* depends mainly upon seasons, and the sun's diurnal position; their force is not so much within the scope of our appreciation. Local conditions exert a marked power upon the force and relative frequency of the various winds. In a flat country, like ours, proximity to the sea is probably the only cause of irregularity in the sequence of the annual

currents: they are far more deranged in mountainous districts: the winds are not, therefore, the same for every spot on the same parallel of latitude, but, like the real mean temperature, deviate widely from the results of calculation or the demands of theory. This irregularity is very considerable at the surface of the earth. Could observations be made high in the atmosphere, it is probable a far greater uniformity, year by year, would be observed. Both the direction and force of the winds vary with the seasons—the difference between the violent gusts of winter and the calmness of summer, especially toward autumn, is familiar to all. No reliable record is made, in our city, of the highly important quality of the “force of the winds;” we must content ourselves, therefore, with a view of their general monthly direction. We subjoin:

We find that in this city the wind prevails, from March to August, from the south-west; and from September to February, from the north-east. The year is equally divided, except for the month of December; yet even here during the night, when the real aerial current may be supposed to be more truly indicated, as we see in the sunrise observation, the wind prevails from the north-east. Much irregularity is, however, observed in the direction and qualities of the wind for similar periods of different years, and both the temperature and dew-point are thereby affected. According to the laws of the aerial circulation in the north temperate zone, and as we find in our city registrations, while the sun is north of the equator the wind blows from

the south-west, but from the north-east when south of the line. The uncertain and fitful north-east winds which prevail here are plainly the returning currents, which, further south, when their strength is augmented, become the trade-winds. The south-west winds are the superficial currents of the atmosphere, which, coursing toward the north, reach the earth at a point generally 30° north of the sun's position and upward. The whole system of the winds is yearly shifted from north to south, centering upon that belt of the earth which has just attained its highest soil-temperature. The air which is heated at the earth *as far as the sun's influence extends*, courses from both sides north and south, toward the belt or great circle of highest temperature, upon which the northward and southward currents meet, and, passing upward, give rise to frequent calms. These currents rise to the higher regions of the atmosphere with the velocity of revolution proper to the latitude of the heated belt, and passing north and south advance north-eastwardly and south-eastwardly toward the poles; these north-eastward currents when they at last reach the earth, in our hemisphere, are the south-west wind.

Near the sea-coast the *sea-breeze* sensibly modifies the direction of the regular seasonal winds at the earth's surface. The sea-breeze is a wind which blows *inland* from the ocean during the day only, induced by the heating of the interior country, whose "upward diurnal currents" give rise to a draught from the sea of cooler and denser air. This wind is most regularly pronounced upon an island of considerable extent, with a ridge of elevations in its centre. During the day the ocean air flows steadily in to supply the place of the ascending earth-heated columns; but after sunset, when the temperature of the earth sinks below that of the air above it, a retrograde motion is established; the cooled and heavier air falls down the mountain-sides with increasing velocity toward the sea, constituting the land-breeze. The land-breeze is never found on the seaboard country of a flat continent; it is necessary for its establishment that there be a chain of mountains of mod-

erate height and extent, at the least, not too far removed from the shore. Within the influence of these mountains, as in the island alluded to, a true mountain-breeze will be felt at night. The sea-breeze generally springs up about ten o'clock, A. M., lasting until near sunset; the land-breeze, where it is found, begins about two hours after dark and lasts until sunrise. The land-breeze is observed in nearly all of the West India islands, and on the western coast of South America, but not on the Atlantic coast of the Confederate States—the country being entirely flat for several hundred miles from the ocean. During that period of our year when the south-west winds are gradually giving place to the north-east winds, calms are frequent both by day and night. During the day, however, the sea-breeze breaks the oppressive stillness of the air, but at night the calm is entirely undisturbed. The heat of the day is thus tempered by the ocean-breezes, which are of lower temperature than winds which have blown over a heated country. Exclusive of elevation, the influence of the sea-breeze explains the greater coolness of our seaboard cities, as compared with inland towns during the day, but at night the reverse obtains. And, again, although the temperature of seaboard cities is some degrees lower their dew-point is always higher; dryness of the air characterizes the climate of the country far inland, as compared with the seaboard; the moderate heat, therefore, of the sea-level is more oppressive, through defect of cutaneous evaporation upon the human economy, than the higher but less exhausting heat of the interior.

At the sea-coast, the effect of heat is still further heightened by the influence of the above-mentioned calmness so frequently observed. The calmness of the nights is greatest about the end of August and during the first half of September, in our city, and diminishes toward the close of the year. No record of this quality has been made, although its importance in many respects it is scarcely possible to over-estimate, for meteorological, and especially for hygienic researches; an approximate observation of the

force of the wind at sunrise is recorded, but as this is only by estimate, no instrument being used, and as, moreover, the observation at sunrise is inadequate to express the windiness of the past night, we are obliged to have recourse to an oblique method, which in some degree expresses the desired figures, as follows :

After a *calm night* the *dew-point temperature of sunrise* will not differ appreciably from the *minimum temperature of the past night*. It is evident that the dew-point of the early morning cannot be greater than the lowest temperature of the night previous, for at this latter temperature, if dew is deposited in the same *volume of air*, or *after a calm night*, no dew-point can exist at a higher temperature. On the other hand, the dew-point of sunrise cannot be appreciably less than the minimum temperature, for the following reasons : The dew-point of sunrise for any two consecutive days may be assumed equal for the means of a long series of years. But, as we have already seen, the dew-point rises progressively during the day with the temperature, and only begins to fall when the declining temperature of the night descends upon it, precipitating a portion of the vapor as dew. The dew-point, therefore, retires at night before the temperature, and in a humid atmosphere the minimum dew-point and minimum temperature *are the same*. But if the *night has been calm* the dew-point of sunrise cannot be different from the minimum dew-point of the night, nor, consequently, from the minimum temperature. In our humid air, in reality, the minimum temperature is a minimum dew-point observation. A coincidence of these figures is, therefore, indicative of calmness of the night previous ; variations from each other in either direction can only be produced by the entrance of wind, which, if moist, gives a higher dew-point, and if cold a lower temperature. Should a gentle breeze from the sea blow all night, neither the temperature nor dew-point will differ from those of the evening before, when we know they did not accord—the dew-point being almost invariably some degree lower than the temperature. Variation, therefore, of the dew-point of sunrise from the minimum temperature of the night pre-

vions, signifies wind, and the approximation of these figures denotes calm, while the *degree* of calmness or windiness will be somewhat indicated by the figures expressing the amount of the divergence of the two records.

Such a table we subjoin. It will be seen that the calmness of the nights diminish from August to November by the successive increase of the numbers for these months :

The indications of the barometer likewise concur with those just considered. The height of the barometer being noted three times a day, at 7, A. M., 2, P. M. and 9, P. M., it is fair to conclude that it records very nearly the atmospheric fluctuations of the twenty-four hours. The range of the barometer is essentially controlled by wind, for its height would obviously remain the same were it continually surrounded by the same mass of air. Whatever changes occur in the density of the atmosphere must either *be caused by wind* or *produce it*, and the barometer will in either case be affected. It has been urged by Espy, that winds, and especially storms, are produced by the agency of the *heat given off in the condensation of vapor*, when currents of different temperatures and hygrometric saturation commingle. Precipitation undoubtedly occurs under these circumstances, and there is generally an upward tendency of such masses of air, but that this is owing to a dilatation by heat appears entirely inadmissible. Vapor is deposited by a *diminution of temperature*, induced either by the direct cooling influence of the earth's surface or that of terrestrial bodies, or by the admixture with the warm mass of another volume of less temperature, a mean temperature of the mixture resulting. In all cases, moisture is only deposited

from the warmer current. But if vapor extricates heat during its condensation, then it has been deposited by some other agency than reduction of temperature, which is the only known mode by which, in nature, water dissolved in air can be separated from it. According to Mr. Espy, a condensation by *cold* would take place in air which is being warmed—which is entirely out of the question. The air in reality, after condensation has occurred, is lower than before in temperature, but of less density. A cubic foot of perfectly dry air at 70° weighs less by ten grains or more than a cubic foot of moist air at the same temperature. When, therefore, the air is cooled down to a point at which it loses the greater part of its moisture, it becomes specifically lighter, the diminution by contraction of bulk in its own volume being inconsiderable when compared with the amount of vapor thrown out of solution and condensed in the fine, globular state in which it floats as cloud, and is suspended by the repulsive electricity of the earth. Such a mass of air tends, therefore, to rise, and we cannot doubt that the winds which are so commonly felt at the earth just *before a fall of heavy rain* are induced by a sudden ascent of those strata in which condensation is advancing from the intermingling of currents. It is impossible to admit Mr. Espy's theory of winds and storms upon the basis of an extrication of heat by condensing vapor.

All such changes, which are of constant occurrence, in the density and moisture of the air, are causes of wind, and are betrayed by the barometer. According to their intensity and frequency, the difference between the highest and lowest indication of the mercury will be of greater or less extent; the barometrical range varies as the *windiness* of the weather. We subjoin:

August, by this record also, is the least windy month, and February the most so. The calmness of the weather increases from February until July, and decreases until the close of the year; the weather becomes more windy, as we have already shown, in August, September and October, successively.

Ozone, or oxygen, in a *positively* electrical state, varies greatly in quantity in the air at different periods of the year. It is created in the atmosphere by electrical induction, by the evaporation of water, by the evaporation of the sap of plants, and *during thunder-storms*—in connection with which we shall especially notice this remarkable substance, whose variations are now *regularly recorded throughout Europe*.

In Marignac's experiments upon the artificial ozonification of oxygen by the spark of the electrical machine, in which a *long* spark was found more efficient than a short one, we are furnished with a direct illustration of the natural formation of ozone during the passage of the lightning flash. The oxygen in the path of the thunderbolt becomes electrified at the moment of discharge, and a union is at the same time effected, to a slight extent, of the oxygen and nitrogen of the air to form nitric acid; or this substance may arise from the action of ozone upon the ammonia which the air always contains in minute quantity. Nitric acid as well as ozone, and ammonia generally in the form of a nitrate, are well known to exist in rain-water, and especially in that which has fallen during a thunder-storm. "Ozone," says De la Rive, "is found in the rain which falls during thunder-storms; this water manifests the same properties observed in distilled water in which ozone has been dissolved;" for "all the qualities of rain-water may be imparted to distilled water by placing it in a cup in communication with the earth, while it is exposed to the action of a powerful machine evolving a strong odor. For the full ozonification of the water, this must continue for at least half an hour." Ozone may be demonstrated in rain water "by the addition of a little sulphuric acid to the

water, paste of iodide of potassium having been first mixed with it; the blue reaction, indicating the liberation of ozone, is then immediately manifest; it might be possible that ozone forms with pure water a compound (possible peroxide of hydrogen) which masks its qualities until set at liberty by the affinity of sulphuric acid for water." In all of seventeen specimens of rain which had fallen during thunder-storms, Liebig was able to detect nitric acid, combined with ammonia or lime: while only in two of *sixty* parcels of rain-water which had fallen without thunder was he able to find even traces of this acid.

The sulphurous odor so commonly mentioned as pervading spots where thunder falls, is due to ozone, as likewise the strong odor sometimes perceived by aeronauts. "Wafer, surgeon of Dampier," says Arago, "relates that in traversing the Isthmus of Darien, the showers he encountered were accompanied with lightning and furious claps of thunder, and that the *air was then pervaded by a sulphurous odor, strong enough to take away the breath, especially in the midst of woods.*" When the English vessel, *Montague*, was struck by lightning in 1749, so strong an odor was diffused around, says Chalmers, that the vessel seemed to be a mass of sulphur. "De Romas shows considerable acuteness in comparing the odor of thunder to that of electrical batteries." Buchwalder, according to Scoutetten, a Swiss engineer, whose duties called him frequently to the highest peaks of the Alps, declares that, being one day on the summit of Senlis, near Appenzel, lying with his domestic beneath a small tent erected on the snow, they were all of a sudden enveloped by the thunder and lightning, whose claps were darting in every direction. The domestic was killed on the spot, and immediately afterward the tent was filled with a very strong and peculiar odor. "One day," says Schönbein, who relates this interesting observation, "I received a visit from M. Buchwalder while experimenting with ozone, its odor filling the laboratory, and I was not a little surprised to hear him declare that he recognized perfectly the odor which he had perceived beneath his tent

on the top of Senlis." The aeronaut, Wise, also states that, during a thunder-storm witnessed by himself when upon a balloon excursion, "the ascending current would carry the balloon upward to a point in the upper cloud, when its force would be expended: the balloon being then driven outward, would fall some distance, then be drawn anew into the vortex, and again be carried upward to perform the same revolution, until I had gone through the *cold furnace* seven or eight times: while all this time the smell of sulphur, or what is now termed *ozone*, was perceptible, and I was sweating profusely from some cause unknown to me, unless it was from undue excitement." (Espy, 4th Meteor. Rep., p. 26.)

There can be no question that ozone is thus produced among the clouds in vast quantities, being widely disseminated, and eventually reaching the earth, according to the direction and force of the wind. Experiment, however, clearly proves that ozone occasionally descends to the earth in great abundance very shortly after its formation above: this is probably the case in calm weather. This is, in part no doubt, owing to the fact that the electrical phenomena of the clouds are intimately associated with the hygrometrical, and, like these, are not in parallelism to the changes in progress near the earth's surface.

The occurrence of thunder-storms is materially affected by the temperature, probably both of the earth and of the air, and also by the direction of the wind. In the warm season, everywhere, thunder-storms are more frequent, and likewise near the equator, in preference to higher latitudes. Singularly enough, however, even under the equator, thunder is sometimes extremely uncommon, or never heard at all, as at Lima in Peru, which is situated upon a lofty plateau; at other places in the same latitude, but at the *sea-level*, it seems to thunder perpetually. In Charleston, thunder and thunder-storms are especially frequent in the months of June and July, and in the early part of August, when the wind blows from the south-west, and the temperature is at its maximum; it is excessively rare for a thun-

der-storm to come in from the *north-east* or ocean. During the period of the warm season, in which the wind habitually blows from the north-east, viz: the latter part of August, and the months of September and October, thunder-storms are uncommon in this city, and are sometimes wholly unobserved. The following figures show the mean monthly prevalence of thunder-storms in Charleston:

Thunder-storms are common in June, are frequent in July, less so in August, and are rare in the following months. This is true for the summer months for nearly all places in the northern hemisphere, except those where the wind is notably irregular: this will be seen from the following table, from Scoutetten, of observations at different places by different observers:

At the above points of observation, thunder-storms would appear to decline very swiftly after having reached their acme of frequency.

Popular experience maintains a well-founded belief that thunder-storms purify the air. After a storm of wind, followed by thunder and rain, the air is cooler and free from foul smells. Nature revives from the exhaustion of a sultry heat, vegetation is renewed, animal life is invigorated, leaves and herbage glow with a fresher green, when the

agitation of the elements is past. Independently of the effects of wind and moisture and the diminution of heat, there can be no doubt that the *presence of ozone* is favorable to the renewed activity of animal and vegetable life at such times, for ozone is known to possess remarkable stimulating properties upon living beings. As we have shown, its presence is sometimes perceptible immediately after a thunder-storm, although, in most cases, it is probably drifted away with the wind. Thus, according to Schiefferdecker, "a notable increase of the ozonicity of the air is sometimes observed after a thunder-storm." We have seen that ozone is brought down in the rain of thunder-storms, and it must, consequently, escape into the air in certain quantity when the moisture is dried up. The ozonic odor may sometimes be plainly perceived during ordinary thunder-storms, and occasionally is even very intense at the surface of the earth: this must depend in part upon the quantity of ozone brought down from the clouds in the rain which falls. Scoutetten states that "if storms be unaccompanied by rain, or furnish but little, ozone does not become sensible at the earth." A day or two after a thunder-storm the ozonoscopic paper frequently reveals a notable increase of ozone in the atmosphere; but this is not always the case: and it should be considered, that the elaboration of this agent in the clouds is by no means a local mechanism relating to the earth beneath, but is only a part of a universal system whereby it is generated continually, and uniformly dispersed for the destruction of effluvia and impurities of all sorts in the air, and for the excitement of the living functions.

The electricity of the earth and atmosphere, which is the active cause of thunder-storms, is likewise able to induce the formation of ozone by *induction*, as in the air around the prime conductor of the electrical machine. The origin of ozone in this way, although independent of actual discharges of electricity, is generally accompanied by thunder and lightning. While, therefore, frequency of thunder shows a high grade of telluric and atmospheric electricity,

rarity of this meteor by no means proves its deficiency, and although ozone is necessarily abundant when thunderstorms are very frequent, it may nevertheless be present in the air in considerable intensity when they are rare or even absent.

Thunder is most often heard in the warm season, for aqueous evaporation is then most active. It is most frequent in the neighborhood of large masses of water, but not upon the aqueous surface itself, diminishing in frequency at sea as we leave the continental shores. According to Arago, there are most probably spots upon the ocean where it never thunders, as well as upon the dry land: thunder is but seldom heard in the great desert of Sahara, and in Egypt it occurs but three or four times a year, and is, moreover, limited to the sea shore and banks of the Nile. This is owing to the necessity of concurrence for the production of electrical discharge of clouds charged with opposite electricity: since, therefore, the earth and the vapor given off from it are, according to Peltier, charged with negative electricity, but the vapor drawn from watery surfaces, with positive electricity, upon the sea, at a distance from the land, as well as upon land at a considerable distance from the ocean, both sky and earth are similarly electrified; no such conjunction of clouds of different electricities can therefore for the production of the phenomena of the thunder-clap, or, but rarely, by some irregularity of the wind.
