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Foreword

With the offering of this beautiful collection of Mr. Harold C. Brooks, of Marshall, Mich. you will notice that we have photographed most of the items, so as to present a Pictorial History of the stamps of the Confederate States.

The collection starts with "**Free Franks**" of President Jefferson Davis, Vice-Pres. Alexander H. Stephens, Commander in Chief, Robert E. Lee and two rare handwritten letters.

Follow: **Postmaster Provisionals**. From the time of the invalidation of the U. S. stamps, June, 1st, 1861, in the states seceded from the Union, the Postmasters were forced to prepare temporary substitutes for the franking of letters, some a makeshift of printer's slugs, the products of their ingenuity, which were either adhesives or envelopes, printed or hand-stamped. This collection offers 120 lots of these rare classics, embracing the pick of the most important collections offered within the past few years, such as:— Ferrari, Hind, Judge Emerson, Stephen Brown, etc.

General Issues: In this group you will find one of the most comprehensive lots one could gather. It gives a well rounded picture of the general use of these stamps in all its forms, **rates, multiple rates, combinations, mixed frankings, cancellations**, etc. As the war progressed, and brought with it numerous hardships and shortage of paper, **Wall Paper** and **Turned Covers** made their appearance.

Every war has left behind its emotional momentos, and in this group, we see stamps playing a very touching part. **Prisoners' Letters** with Censor Seals, **Flag of Truce** markings, passed through the lines by agreement and delivered to their destination.

Patriotic Covers: Here, too, the high pitch of patriotism could not but appear in some form. In this wonderful group of covers we see glorification of a flag defended, and pictures of **Generals, Designs** and **Verses** expressing deep passion.


Express covers, shortly after the outbreak of the war June 1861, letters between North and South were carried largely by Express Companies. On Aug. 26, 1861 this traffic ceased by order of the U. S. Post Office. These Express Covers and Blockade Runners are extremely rare, and are seldom found.

Therefore, we say that this interesting and unusual group of Confederates, gathered by Mr. Brooks with keen knowledge is a rare opportunity for both cover collectors and others to add to their hobby many fascinating and educational items presented herein.

Christmas Money for You

Without Trouble or Expense

High Prices Paid for Old Stamps on the Original Envelopes

MANY OLD STAMPS, both U. S. and Confederate, are worth from \$50 to \$5,000 each. Not all old stamps are rare, but generally speaking, the most valuable ones are of the old issues. Collectors during the past few years have been studying postmarks as well as stamps so that today nearly all old stamps are worth more on the original envelopes than those which have been cut off. A rare stamp removed from the envelope while still valuable, is worth from 10% to 50% more when on the envelope.

When clearing out attics and storerooms, old correspondence is often destroyed. There may be good reasons for burning letters of a private nature, but the *envelopes* bearing stamps should be saved and sent to Mayor Brooks of Marshall, Michigan.

Mr. Brooks requests the readers of *THE WITNESS* to make a thorough search through old trunks for correspondence running from 1845 to 1870. The letters may be saved and the envelopes (or folded letters) sent to him for inspection and appraisal. He will examine them carefully and make a prompt report. No one is obliged to sell unless Mr. Brooks' offer is acceptable. In the event the envelopes are not purchased, he guarantees to return them in good order.

The stamps especially desired are U. S. and Confederate, but Canadian, Hawaiian and other foreign issues are purchased provided they were used before 1870. The majority of stamps used after that date are extremely common and of little or no value.

Mr. Brooks is a private collector who during

the past eight years has paid thousands of dollars to people answering his advertisements. Loose stamps he does not buy except very old issues unused, or mounted collections formed before 1880. Revenue stamps, such as found on old photographs, deeds, mortgages, etc., are not wanted. Other things like old coins, Confederate money, old books or relics, may be of value but he is not interested in these. He is, however, willing to appraise and submit offers on old autograph letters of men who were prominent in early American history — Franklin, Washington, Jefferson, Adams, Marshall, Hamilton, etc.

Besides the rare stamps, Mr. Brooks buys thousands of duplicates of the commoner varieties for study purposes, so nothing should be thrown away even though many stamps may appear to be exact duplicates.

No dates or other marks should be written as these are not needed and are often hard to remove. Bunches of envelopes should be well wrapped and protected with cardboard to prevent wrinkling or damage in the mails. If sent by registered mail Mr. Brooks agrees to refund the postage expense.

If you have no old letters written during or before the Civil War, show this notice to your friends—especially those whose families have lived in the same home for several generations. Many old families, old banks and law firms still have stored away hundreds of letters, waiting either to be burned or sold for large sums. Before destroying such envelopes or folded letters *investigate their value.*

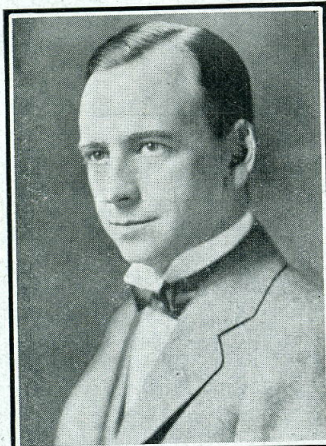
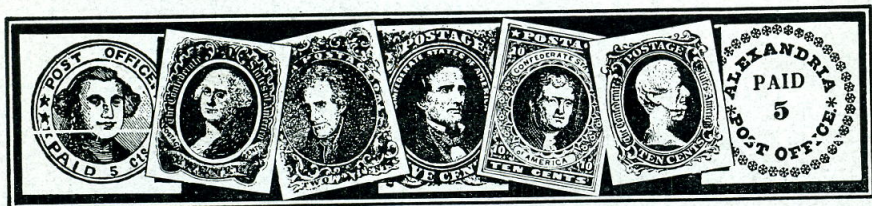

Meet Mayor Harold C. Brooks of Marshall, Mich.

The Only Democratic Mayor of a Michigan City Re-elected for the Sixth Term in a Republican Community—and a Philatelist.



WHEN a man's political opponents consistently decline to place a candidate against him—when they even cast their ballots for him—it is a credit to the intelligence of that community and the highest tribute to the worth of the man. Such is the unique situation in Marshall, Mich., a Republican stronghold with its Democratic Mayor—**HAROLD CRAIG BROOKS.**

I have been out to Marshall, and I know Harold Brooks. And instinctively I felt the why of it all. Service—that overworked word in our language—is the key to a life that is being rightly lived. Men of his type could solve all of our national problems.

Harold Brooks is still a young man, as we count the years, for he has barely turned forty-five, yet those years have been filled with purpose and achievement. He is an idealist—but an idealist of action.

Born in Ceresco, Mich., he received a thorough education in the schools of his native State. In 1901 he started with his father, C. E. Brooks, in the manufacture of a type of hernial appliance, since which time the Brooks Appliance Co. has grown to large proportions with branch offices in nearly all foreign countries.

He was married in 1908 to Miss Gladys J. Wright, of Marshall. There are three children. He is a member of the Protestant Episcopal Church, Knights Templars, Sons of the American Revolution, and of various golf and philatelic societies here and abroad. He finds recreation in stamps, golf, landscape gardening and local historical study.

Harold Brooks was first elected Mayor in 1925, and reelected each succeeding year—thus holding the longest unopposed

tenure of a mayoral office in Michigan.

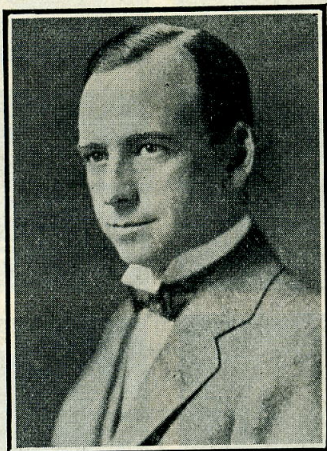
Always interested in the preservation of historic sites and buildings, he has presented to the Marshall Country Club a commodious club-house after the style of Mount Vernon; a public skating rink with club-house; a \$30,000 electric fountain in the form of a Greek temple, a memorial to his father; a set of chimes in the new town hall; and in addition, the services

of a landscape artist who supplies free plans to the residents. He is now engaged in compiling the history of his city, a volume to commemorate the Centenary of Marshall, to be celebrated this year.

His stamp-collecting career began during a stay in London in 1910-1911. In the succeeding years he spent nearly \$60,000 advertising in rural and religious papers of the East and South, for old envelopes on appraisal. From this accumulation was formed his present valuable collection of early United States and Confederate covers, Postmasters and Patriotics.

Among these finds—and he possesses the only known copies—are the New Haven Postmaster's envelope, blue impression on white paper; the Confederate Locals of Austin, Miss. and Kingston, Ga.; several new varieties of listed Provisionals; a superb One-Cent 1851 Type I. (7R1e), and hundreds of other valuable covers. Many interesting documents and letters came into his possession in this way, the most remarkable being a letter written by Benjamin Franklin from Passy in 1780, throwing new light on the subject of the battle between the "Serapis" and the "Bon Homme Richard."

It is a treat to inspect his treasures. It is a privilege to know Harold Brooks.

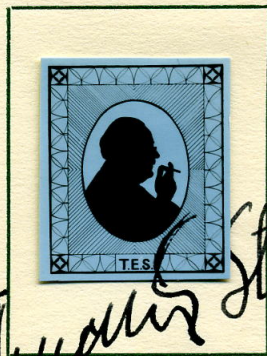

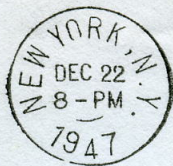
