CONDITIONS OF SALE

Bidding

- I.—All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalogue. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot prior to sale, to divide a lot, or to group two or more lots.
- **II.**—The highest bidder shall prevail. Should any dispute arise between bidders the decision of the auctioneer as to the successful bidder and the reoffering or resale of the lot under dispute shall rest entirely on the judgement of the auctioneer. Title shall remain in the Executor of the Will of Alfred H. Caspary until payment is received and delivery made to the buyer. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and reserves the right to refuse any bid believed by him not to be made in good faith.

Payment For Purchases

- **III.—Floor Bidders.** The name and address of the buyer of each lot shall be given to the auctioneer immediately following the sale of such lot. Payment of the whole purchase price, or such part thereof shall be made by the floor buyer in such manner as the auctioneer may determine.
- IV.—Mail Bidders. Successful mail-bidders will be notified of lots allocated to them and must remit before the lots are sent. Delivery to successful mail bidders will be at the addresses indicated on their bid sheets. Persons known to us, or who furnish satisfactory references, may, at our option, have their stamps forwarded to them for immediate payment. A minimum charge of 25c will be made for mailing and insurance.

Authenticity

- V.—Each iot is sold as genuine but when in the opinion of any competent authority acceptable to H. R. Harmer, Inc., the lot is declared otherwise, the purchase price will be refunded in full, provided that such claim is received by H. R. Harmer, Inc., within a period of twenty-one days from the date of the auction.
- VI.—Any lot, description of which is incorrect, is returnable only within three days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact, as received. Lots containing five or more stamps are not returnable at any time. No lots may be returned by purchasers who have had an opportunity to examine them before the sale. Stamps described as having defects are not returnable on account of their condition. Stamps cannot be returned on account of centering when such stamps are illustrated.

New York City Sales Tax

- VII.—The New York City Sales Tax (3%) is payable by buyers liable to tax who accept delivery in the City. Out-of-town mail buyers do not pay the Tax.
- VIII.—The placing of a bid shall constitute acceptance of the foregoing conditions of sale.

3. Floor buyers. Attention is particularly drawn to Condition of Sale III. Full payment or a substantial deposit will be required, immediately following the purchase of any lot, from a person unknown to us.

4. Delivery of lots. Lots may be cleared during or immediately following the auction from H. R. Harmer personnel in the lobby leading to the Trianon Room. In the case of mail-bidders, lots will be sent by Registered mail, insured, failing contrary instructions.

5. Exhibition of Lots. Opposite first page of descriptions.

6. Out-of-town viewing.
 Lots will be sent for postal viewing to clients known to us in the United States. Early application essential due to exhibition in other cities from February 11th.

7. Valuations. Available during exhibition. Valuations of lots of particular interest sent on receipt of stamped addressed card or envelope.

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FOREWORD

by Mr. August Dietz, Sr.

It would seem as though at one time or another, all the rare Postmasters' Provisionals of the Confederacy, on their far-flung wanderings, had decided to meet and hold their last assembly in the sanctuary prepared for them by Alfred H. Caspary, there to find roof and rest and recognition, and there to await the final rites that would send them out into the world as missionaries of the stamps of The Lost Cause.

With the passing of their champion, this treasure-chest is unlocked for the first time and its dazzling contents spread out in the public market place.

Such an occasion as this can occur but once in philatelic history. There will never be another Caspary; but in future years, after this great wealth of material is dispersed to the four winds, many a collector here and abroad will point with pride to some gem among his treasures and call but a name: "Caspary."

Up to this time Philately spoke with bated breath of Ferrari, the great accumulator of the world's stampic rarities, whose very name could cast its spell over the elect in stampdom. But even that recluse's fame dims as we turn the pages of this catalog and view the splendid array of all-inclusive superb material gathered through the years by this kenner-student . . . To write a Foreword for this catalog of the Confederate Postmasters' Provisionals is the most difficult task ever assigned to this writer!

To one who has given his best years to the study of Confederates, the topic of Provisionals has ever been one to intrigue, for every piece of this material spells a page in the South's story of the tragic period of the War Between the States, and Caspary must have had a particular fondness for these mementos, for he alone succeeded in gathering practically a complete showing of all known listings and varieties. Thus, for rarity and collector-interest, it easily outclasses all other collections of Confederate Provisionals. Of many of its gems there is but one known copy!

Earlier Notable Collections

It is like rummaging in Memory's musty treasure chest to recall the earlier collectors of Confederate Postmasters' Provisionals, for during the past sixty-odd years it has been the writer's privilege to know personally nearly all of the great leaders in this field—from Hiram E. Deats, the pioneer student and the inspiration to those who followed: Robert Sidney Nelson, who made the first "great find", adown the line of Philately's paladins: Edward S. Knapp, Gerald Curtis, Stanley Ashbrook, Judge Robert Emerson, Horace Davis, Harold Brooks, Steve Brown, Henry Needham, Joseph Steinmetz, Senator Ackerman, R. Duke Hay, S. E. Richey, Albert Steves, George Walcott, and Charley Phillips. Drinkwater and Waterhouse in England, and Ferrari plus his secretary Pierre Mahe, in Paris, were frequent correspondents and sent over material for authentication.

A visit from Caspary, too, is recalled at the time of writing my "Postal Service", years ago. He spent the forenoon in my modest museum of the graphic arts, "talking stamps" and deeply interested in a demonstration of lithography, engraving and ty-pography as practiced during the war years in this Capital City of the Confederacy. He impressed the writer as a modest man and a student of the subjects under discussion. It was the only time we met.

Some notes on some notables

Athens, Ga. A magnificent array of this stamp in its two types (unsevered pairs and a strip of four) in both purple and the exceedingly scarce red in both types is offered in lots 3 to 24.

Autaugaville, Ala. Two copies of this rare envelope will probably have close competition.

Baton Rouge, La. Four copies of the extremely scarce 2c, including the error "McCcrmick", are gem to invite a real contest. While there is a sufficient number of the 5c (24 lots, including every variety) to satisfy many contestants, the two fine lots of the rare 10c will surely tax someone's budget — be well worth the investment.

Beaumont, Goliad, Gonzales, Helena, Independence, Port Lavaca, and Victoria, all in Texas. This State Group is going to make some Texans round-up and market a good size herd of cattle and probably throw in the ranch, too. But it's going to be "wuth it" to "rope" the finest and rarest Lone Star State collection ever corraled. Others may "gaze on 'em and weep." **Danville**, Va. Postmaster and publisher Coleman's artistic typeset 5c has come to be quite a favorite stamp among the Confederate Provisionals and promises an animated contest, while the "Shoe-Dealer's Advertisement-Cut" envelope has always been a favorite.

Emory, Va. The unique adhesive handstamped on sheet margins of the U.S. 1857 1 cent stamps ranks high among the improvised substitutes.

Greenville, Ala. Another of the rarities among the Provisionals, with a fascinating history and . . . clever counterfeits that did **not** sting Caspary! Their story goes that they were prepared by the postmaster, Mr. B. F. Porter, who was judge in the town during the war. Porter was also an amateur printer and is said to have personally set the types and done the printing.

Grove Hill, Ala. This is probably the greatest rarity of the Confederate Postmasters' Provisionals. The medium was a somewhat crudely executed woodcut, which was either printed on a handpress or handstamped. Like most Postmasters' Provisionals, there is no recorded data about it.

Jetersville, Va. This is another interesting object that will arrest your attention.

Knoxville, Tenn. The Knoxvilles are well known, but the 5c brick red vertical pair deserves special attention, and will get it.

Lenoir, N.C. The catalog description goes into full detail concerning this favorite, and it is predicted that there will be challenging competition for these covers.

Livingston, Ala. The most artistic Provisional in the Confederate group! Three remarkable covers franked with singles, and a fourth with a horizontal pair, said to be the most outstanding and valuable Confederate item in existence. Livingston and Mobile share the distinction of being the only "pictorials" issued up to that time. Probably both were engraved and lithographed by Robertson of Mobile. The Livingston has repeatedly been the object of fierce competition in earlier auctions. The chances are that it will remain a coveted prize.

Marion, Va. Three covers with Postmaster Francis' famous "Check" of the 5c and one with the 10c will cause no little excitement when "put on the block", especially the latter. Postmaster Francis always made the undisputed claim to having issued the first Postmasters' Provisional. He called them "Checks" and this designation appears in the printing. The figures of value ("5" or "10") were handstamped individually as needed.

Mobile, Ala. The two values of this Provisional — 2c and 5c — have always been great favorites — in particular, the black 2c denomination, which is ranked among "the Better Things." The ten items of this denomination offered should bring forth active bidding. There is a large showing in singles and pairs of the 5c blue.

Mt. Lebanon, La. This is probably the most unique stamp in the catalog. The method of its making is so ingenious that to describe it would take more space than can be spared.

Nashville, Tenn. Outstanding as a rarity among the great number of the 5c Nashvilles, are the two 10c greens, which will be among the better things in this sale.

New Orleans, La. Prominent among a great array of the Provisionals of all types issued in this city are the two items of the 5c red (one on blue paper).

New Smyrna, Fla. This town is represented by but one stamp — but a great rarity — the 10c on 5c black with its reversed value "01", a real curiosity.

Pittsylvania C. H., Va. These Pittsylvanias are among the choice objects of this sale.

Pleasant Shade, Va. Gems! These covers, we predict, will be all but fought over, even as in earlier years. The postmaster at Pleasant Shade, Va. must have been favorably impressed with the stamp prepared for the postmaster of Petersburg, Va. for he forthwith commissioned A. F. Crutchfield & Co., publishers of the **Daily Express** in Petersburg, to print a similar Provisional for his office. Crutchfield, who had the forms standing of the Petersburg, merely lifted out the typeset inscriptions (town name and W. E. Bass, P. M.) and substituted "Pleasant Shade, Virginia" and "R. E. Davis, P. M.". The original setting of the Petersburg consisted of a group of ten units, five horizontal and two deep, of which practically every stamp shows one or more inverted border sections. The identical evidence of the printer's carelessness are to be found on both the Petersburg and the Pleasant Shade, proving that both stem from the same typesetting. The Petersburgs were printed in red, the Pleasant Shades in blue. The latter is an extremely scarce stamp.

Salem, Va. The copy used from Liberty, Va. is unique and should attract active bidding.

Unionville, S. C. Here is another most desirable object and a bit of a curio.

Uniontown, Ala. A gorgeous lot of these old favorites awaits the closing bid, in this, the greatest auction of Postmasters' Provisionals ever staged in philatelic history!
