PREFACE.

There is probably no amusement of the present day more popular and instructive than that of collecting Foreign Postage Stamps, and in the hopes that we can add to the present number of collectors has induced us to write these few lines.

Postage Stamps were first issued in Great Britain in the year 1840, and from time to time have been adopted by other countries, our own Government first issuing them in 1847, and now there is scarcely a country in the world that has not acceded to this method of pre-paying postage, so that it must be at once apparent to every intelligent person, that there is a vast deal of information gained from the study of these labels, coming as they do from every part of the world, and bearing on their face, either the arms of the State or portrait of the ruler, and in nearly all cases the currency of the country where used, so that unconsciously the collector is made acquainted with the Geography, History, and Currency of the various nations.

Were we to enumerate all the advantages to be gained from the study of Philately, we should far exceed the limits of the present work, so we must refer our readers for information to *The American Journal of Philately*.

THE AMERICAN JOURNAL OF PHILATELY IS THE BEST. \$1.00 PER YEAR. SPECIMEN COPIES, WITH UNUSED STAMP, ONLY 12 CENTS." Wishing further information in regard to this curious announcement, I made the following inquiries, and knowing that all Stamp collectors must be deeply interested in the result, publish them for the benefit of my fellow-collectors.

Q. "Can you tell me the meaning of the word Philately?"

A. "Philately is derived from the two Greek words, *philos*, a friend, and *telos*, a tax, and although the word may not be quite appropriate, is the best obtainable from a classical source, and is as appropriate as one-half the names for modern inventions derived from Greek or Latin roots."

Q. "Well, what is this JOURNAL OF PHILATELY?"

A. "It is a 16-page magazine, devoted to the interests of the Stamp collectors and is illustrated with beautiful engravings of newly-issued and rare Stamps, printed in the correct colour of the Stamps represented."

Q. "It really is very beautiful; does it pay?"

A. Q. "Did you ever make or save anything by subscribing to it?"

A. "Yes; I calculate I save about \$12 per year by subscribing, because I buy about \$2 worth of stamps a month, and by reading this I find out where to buy stamps the cheapest, and so get my stamps about 25 per cent. less than most persons. I never get swindled by buying counterfeits, which most persons do; this makes a saving of another quarter; and as I keep posted in regard to newly-issued stamps, do not buy stamps for scarce, because I have never seen them before, but wait till they get common, and when I find out that a stamp is going to be discontinued, I buy it before it gets scarce, and thus save about 50 per cent. I would buy the *American Journal of Philately* if it cost \$1.00 per number."

This was sufficient, and I went down to the office and subscribed at once; and I think anyone who collects stamps will do the same, unless they have more money than they know what to do with.
