- 3. Persons known to me will have their lots forwarded immediately. All others will be notified and the lots will be forwarded upon receipt in full.
- 4. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalogue. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot prior to sale, to divide a lot, or to group two or more lots.
- 5. The highest bidder shall prevail. Should any dispute arise between bidders the decision of the auctioneer as to the successful bidder and the reoffering or resale of the lot under dispute shall rest entirely on the judgement of the auctioneer. Title shall remain in John A. Fox until payment is received and delivery made to the buyer. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and reserves the right to refuse any bid believed by him not to be made in good faith.
- 6. Each lot is sold as genuine but when in the opinion of any competent authority acceptable to John A. Fox, the lot is declared otherwise, the purchase price will be refunded in full, provided that such is received by John A. Fox, within a period of twenty-one days from the date of the auction.

The collection contained in this auction consists of the provisional stamps issued to facilitate the handling of the mail by the Confederate Postmaster of New Orleans before the general issues of the Confederacy were printed. It has been formed over a period of over 35 years. Frederic J. Grant, a foremost student of 19th century United States and particularly of Confederate issues, has long been recognized as the leading authority on the New Orleans Postmaster Provisionals. The collection consists of the finest specimens contained in the Knapp, Brown and Emerson Collections, together with many outstanding stamps and covers acquired by Mr. Grant from other sources. The original platings of Knapp and Brown are offered, but have been improved on wherever possible when Mr. Grant acquired a more perfect specimen. It is indeed a privilege to have the opportunity of offering this collection at public sale. Every effort has been made to issue a catalogue, which together with the Prices Realized, will certainly be a handbook of the future. With the exception of the Riddell letter, every lot in the sale has been photographed.

CATALOGUE

JOHN L. RIDDELL — CONFEDERATE POSTMASTER OF NEW ORLEANS

John Leonard Riddell was born in 1807 in Leydon, Mass., and was educated at Harvard where he specialized in chemistry and botany. In 1836 he was given the position as professor of chemistry at Tulane University in New Orleans, and in 1838 President Van Buren appointed him as technical head of the New Orleans mint. Professor Riddell is known in the scientific world for his botanical studies and especially for the invention of the binocular microscope.

In August, 1860, Professor Riddell was appointed Postmaster of New Orleans by President Buchanan and so ably did he handle the affairs of the office that he was retained by the Confederate Government although attempts were made to oust him because he was a "Yankee" and regarded himself as being still responsible to the Federal Post Office Department. The capture of New Orleans by General Butler on April 25th, 1862, ended forever the Confederate Postal Service in that City.

THE CONFEDERATE

POSTMASTER'S PROVISIONAL STAMPS

OF NEW ORLEANS

Planned by Postmaster John L. Riddell, these stamps are the earliest adhesives issued in the Confederacy and the best known of the provisionals. They were printed from stereotypes by the firm of John V. Childs of #10 Camp Street. The need for them ceased late in 1861 as the general issues were on sale in New Orleans. However, the Two Cent in red is known cancelled in April, 1862, only a few days before the city was captured on the 25th by the Federal Troops.




THE TWO CENT


The first printing of the Two Cents stamps was in red but the sheets were held back because they did not have an inscription describing their usage. Reprinted in blue with the proper inscription the stamps went in use on July 3rd, 1861. At a much later date, probably in 1862, the supply of the Two Cents in blue became exhausted and some of the red stamps were placed on sale. The Two Cents stamps were used for drop letters within the New Orleans city limits and also for paying the postage on form letters and circulars to distant points. Very few covers are in existence.

THE FIVE CENT - FIRST PRINTING

The first printings of the Five Cent Stamp were on white paper and extended over the period June 12th to August 20th. Most of the impressions are clear cut altho there is quite a variation in the shade of brown ink used. One shade known as "Ochre" seems to be on porous paper as the stamps of this shade are quite blurred.

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



THE FIVE CENT - THIRD PRINTING

The Third Printing was after December 3rd and is on a yellowish wove paper which did not give very sharp impressions. Stamps of this printing are very rare used, but quite common unused as there were many remainders. The Confederate General Issues were on sale in New Orleans in November and apparently all the Five Cents Provisionals were withdrawn from sale before the end of 1861.

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

NEW ORLEANS STAMPS USED BY OTHER POST OFFICES

Shortly after Postmaster Riddell issued his stamps, complaints and criticism came from other postmasters because the New Orleans stamps were being offered for payment of postage in their offices. Very few copies escaped their vigilance and the public soon learned the stamps were for exclusive use in New Orleans. These outside cancellations are very rare.
