LYNN K. BRUGH, JR.

An ardent fan of Civil War history, virtually every cover and autograph in Lynn Brugh's collection was researched to the fullest both philatelically and historically. He derived the most out of the "postal" and "history", building an impressive collection truly worthy of the full meaning of postal history. He was additionally very conscious of condition, thus the "average" cover in his collection was usually "very fine". If a rare item was in less than desirable condition he was not so condition conscious so as to pass up a good addition to his collection, however. His autographs were rarely simply signatures, but rather usually lengthy autograph letters signed, brimming with the history and personality that made the individual famous. Similarly, his covers frequently contained fascinating letters replete with battle details and troop movements.

Lynn was a graduate of Washington and Lee University and a great admirer of Robert E. Lee as is evident by the many Lee items in his collection. A retired stock broker, he was confined to home in later years. Although not a big letter writer, Lynn made extensive use of the telephone to stamp and autograph dealers as well as his many collector friends. We remember Lynn's cheerful phone calls either enquiring about an auction lot or passing on the latest philatelic gossip. His wry humor and hearty laugh were always a pleasant break in a hectic business day.

On March 6th of this year, at the age of seventy six, Lynn K. Brugh, Jr. passed away in Hagerstown, Md. He will be sorely missed by the philatelic community.

Oct 15 (18)96, a **CSA General**, answering war queries thirty years later "as to . . . why the Confeddy failed I think it can no more be answered in brief or general terms than could the question why A beats B a long contested game of chess", slight edge separation, Fine .. **E-E**
- 2 **Geo. T. Anderson (CSA General)** ALS, 4vo, on official Police Hdqs stationery, Atlanta May 25, 1877 as police captain regrets declining dinner invitation "to aid in burying the animosities of the past", slight fold separation, Fine **E-F**
- 3 **Turner Ashby** "Appd" endorsement of printed & filled in "**Requisition for forage** for G.S. Wards horses in the service of the Confederate States Army on March to Bath and at Martinsburg" dated 3d of January 1862, made **CSA General** in May 1862 & killed in action June 6, 1862, this requisition was for the abortive foray by Stonewall Jackson into West Virginia in the dead of winter, small 1/2" nick out of fold, faint foxing, still Fine **E-G**
- 4 **G.T. Beauregard** ALS as **CSA General**, 2 page, 8vo, Charleston, S.C. Oct 5th 1862 to Mrs Le Vert in Mobile concerning "demonstration of the Yankees in front of your lay. They will not do much until their iron clads are ready . . . by that time Mobile could be made next to impregnable" etc. excellent letter shows him self proclaimed "connoisseur" of the ladies, tiny tape repairs, faint typewritten transcript offset. Letter both charming & full of military details **E-I**
- 5 **Genl G.T. Beauregard** signed cover "To the friends of the South in Canada" in his hand, 8vo ALS to same headed New Orleans May 28/80 socially presenting his niece from Texas, slight ink offset o/w Very Fine, **Two signatures** of this illustrious **CSA General** **E-I**
- 6 **G.T. Beauregard** ALS, 4vo, New York, Nov 27, 1838, the year he graduated from West Point, famous **CSA General**, FL bearing **New Port, R.I.** CDS & rate, Fine **E-G**
- 7 **G.T. Beauregard** ALS, 8vo, 1 1/2 pages headed New Orleans, June 16th 1854 concerning plans for the U.S. mint in New Orleans, Very Fine **E-H**
- 8 **G.T. Beauregard 1867** signed photograph across front, also signed on reverse "with compliments of Genl Beauregard, **CSA General**, some toned spots, small scrape, crease TL, Average **E-G**

- 9 **J. P. Benjamin** ALS, 8vo, 4 pages, headed 4 Lamb Building, Temple, 29 May 1867, Judah P. Benjamin was CSA Secretary of War, Only major Jewish Confederate leader; this is a marvelous letter to Mr. Mason (Confederate Commissioner to Great Britain & France) of Mason/Slidell fame asking him to forward a letter to "our dear friend (Jefferson Davis) whose release from captivity is a source of so much joy", mentions McRae emigrating to British Honduras, Breckinridge returning to Canada, "lawless seizures of (Prioleau's) vessels and other litigation together with newspapers lies about claims against him for millions", "I was over in Paris . . . Slidell is the same as ever", news of Wigfall & Hotze, "Shall you remain in Canada? I think that if the Southern States are restored to their rights of representation, you will find it consistent with self-respect to return to Va" etc, Incredible newsy & important historical Benjamin letter, signature on the front! **E-O**
- 10 **John C. Breckinridge** LS, 8vo, headed Washington Jan 11/58 as **U.S. Vice President**, later a **CSA General** at Vicksburg & Chickamauga & **CSA Secretary of War**; this letter saying he does not think llamas from Peru can successfully be imported into Western & Southern States, amusing, Very Fine **E-J**
- 11 **John C. Breckinridge (U.S. Vice President, CSA General, CSA Secretary of War)** ALS, 4vo, as CSA General dated Jackson, Miss June 12, 1863 to **CSA General Beauregard** with ANS of G.T. Beauregard on bottom of same page headed Charleston, S.C. July 15, 1863; letter of introduction from Breckinridge to Beauregard about Dr. Blackburn who wishes to go to Havana, Beauregard then sent the letter on to Genl WHC Whiting in Wilmington, N.C. from whence Dr. Blackburn presumably took a blockade runner to Havana, tape stain along left edge o/w Fine, Rare, two famous generals signatures on most interesting letter **(Photo)** **E-O**

- 13 **Jeffn Davis** (Confederate President) LS headed U.S. Senate Chamber June 12th 1858, a letter of reference, 8vo, Fine **E-H**
- 14 **Jeffn Davis** (Confederate President) signature as U.S. Secretary of War on May 13 '56 long clerk docketing on letter to Davis from Bureau of Topographical Engineers about charts, 4vo, some file fold separation, edge foxing o/w Fine **E-H**
- 15 **Jeffn Davis** (Confederate President) docketing as U.S. Secretary of War Jan 6 '53 on 4vo letter from gentleman asking to spend a few weeks in the Bureau examining old records, permission was not granted, Fine **E-H**
- 16 **Jeffn Davis** (CSA President) ALS, 4vo, headed U.S. House of Reps 2d Feby 1846 to the President of the U.S., recommending that A.S. - 18 **Jefferson Davis** 2 page, 8vo ALS written & signed by **Variva Davis**, Beauvoir 14 April 1887 to Joseph Francis congratulating him on congressional recognition for his services to humanity, expressing "admiration for your invention of corrugating the iron so as to increase the strength and yet retain the lightness of your lifeboat", Fine **E-F**
- 19 **Varina Howell Davis**, Wife of CSA President Jefferson Davis, ALS, 1½ page, 8vo, headed Beauvoir 7th Sept 1888 to Gen (Jubal) Early "mails are shockingly out of gear" etc, small internal tear, Fine..... **E-F**
- 20 **(Jubal A) Early** (CSA General) 4 page ALS, 4vo, headed Lynchburg, Va May 11, 1887 to Genl Payne, Early explains in great detail why he cannot accompany Payne to Europe. He mentions his annual salary of \$30,000 for superintending the drawing of the Louisiana State Lottery, and his dependence on this money for the support of his family. Lengthy intimate letter! Fine **E-G**
- 21 **Wade Hampton** (CSA General) LS, on State of South Carolina Executive Chamber stationery date Nov 6, 1877 as **Governor of S.C.**, later also U.S. Senator, fold separation tape repaired o/w Fine **E-F**

- 49 **Dabney H. Maury** (Confederate General) ALS, 8vo, headed St Tammany Parish, La July 22, 1866 after the war, Very Fine E-F
- 50 **M.F. Maury** LS, 4vo, National Observatory, May 29, 1850 enclosing Bill of Lading for Pocket Chronometers seat per Adams Express, CSA officer & famous America hydrographer, Very Fine E-F

I would rather see the whole State desolated as Virginia is, rather than dishonoured, by a feeble effort to look back in its escape from the Yankee Sodom . . ." An extraordinary letter docketed on the last page by Governor Vance: "File & Copy. J.B.V." **E-I**

Rosencrans and Secretary Stanton. A letter from Beverly states that the area is mostly of a secessionist bent, Denver further mention the destruction to property that had taken place and Avers that the legacy from the Civil War will take more than 50 years to eradicate. An Aug 1862 letter from Memphis criticizes the leadership of Gen Sherman. Letters written during the 70's reflect on Indian affairs, land settlements in California, a trip to Colorado Springs expousing the merits of the narrow guage railroad there. An 1877 letter discussed the presidency of Hayes and his appointments to the Cabinet, Hayes rebuking the Radical Republicans, in all a most interesting contemporary account of the political atmosphere. 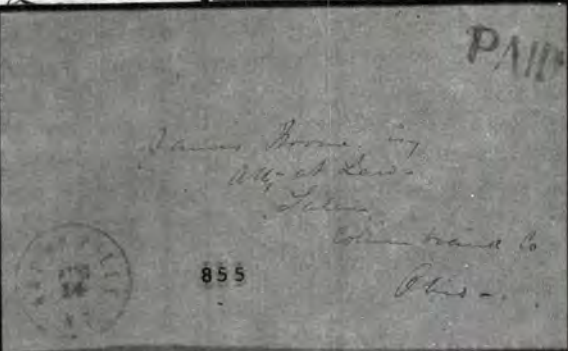

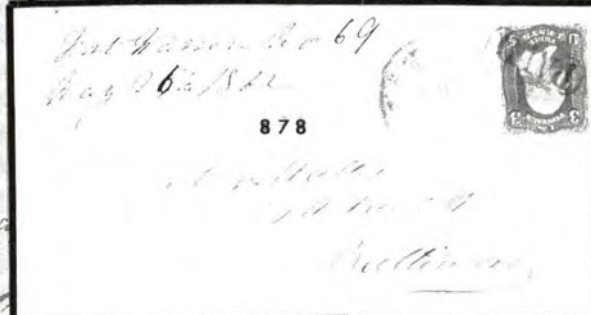
