"GENERAL" JACK SOLOMON



"General" Jack Solomon was born in New York City 60 years ago. He started collecting when he was 10 years old, first as a general collector, later specializing in United States and then in Great Britain and colonies. It was 23 years later in 1954 at an ASDA show that he saw Confederate stamps for the first time at Raynor Hubbell's booth. As Jack tells it, "I was flabbergasted when I saw these stamps. Always a history buff, I found myself holding actual momentos of an era that continues to fascinate historians and students of the period. I was converted instantly."

It didn't take long for Jack to really get into Confederate collecting. In a relatively few short years he was exhibiting in many parts of the country winning Grand and Reserve Grand Awards as well as gold and silver medals. Jack is very proud of his Confederate Stamp Alliance membership and especially of the title "General, CSA" conferred on him as a Past President. Almost from the day he joined in 1954 he has been a very active member and has served as Membership Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and as President. More recently he was appointed chairman of the Nominating Committee. A more dedicated Confederate Yankee is not to be found.

Jack is married to his Sylvia for 40 years. He was 19 and an optician and she, at 18, was in her graduating class in college. They have two children—Stanley, an optician, and Lois, who works with retarded children for Catholic Charities. They also have two beautiful grand-children.

The collection offered here is one of the finest extant, containing many celebrated rarities from some of the worlds greatest Confederate collections. Due to the great magnitude of so many of the covers, it is impossible to highlight individual lots without leaving out major items or filling pages upon pages. Material of this type rarely comes to market and this sale represents a real opportunity to acquire items that are seldom seen or made available.
