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The property described in this catalogue, which description may be amended by sale room notice or announcement, will be offered for sale by Christie, Manson & Woods International, Inc. ("Christie's"), as agent for various owners or other consignors ("sellers").

These Conditions of Sale set forth below constitute the complete terms and exclusive statement of the conditions on which all such property is offered for sale. Christie's reserves the right to vary the terms of sale. By bidding at auction, whether present in person or by agent, by written bid, telephone or other means, the buyer agrees to be bound by these Conditions of Sale.

- 1. As used in these Conditions of Sale, the term "the final bid" means the highest bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, and the term "the purchase price" means the sum of the final bid and the premium payable by the buyer under Condition 4.
- 2. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer of the lot offered for sale, subject to the terms set forth in these Conditions of Sale. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his absolute discretion, and, in the event of any dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. Should there be any dispute after the sale, Christie's record of final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. Christie's reserves the right to withdraw any lot before or at the sale.
- 4. The purchase price payable by a buyer shall be the sum of the final bid and a premium of 10% of the final bid.
- 5. All lots marked with next to the lot number are offered subject to a reserve, which is the confidential minimum price agreed to with the seller below which the lot will not be sold ("seller's reserve"). Christie's shall act to protect the seller's reserve as agent of the seller by bidding through the auctioneer. The auctioneer may open the bidding on any lot below the reserve by placing a bid on behalf of the seller. The auctioneer may continue to bid on behalf of the seller up to the amount of the reserve, either by placing consecutive bids or by placing bids in response to other bidders.
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- Bidders must advise Christie's in writing prior to or on the date of the auction as to all items with respect to which a certificate of authenticity is desired;
- (ii) Christie's will submit all such items to an independent authority chosen by Christie's for certification;

(iii) Except with respect to items certified as not authentic, buyers of certified items must pay as part of the purchase price all charges for certification, including postage, mail registration and handling;

(iv) Buyers of items to be certified must make payment in full immediately upon purchase in accordance with paragraphs 6 and 10 hereof. Christie's will refund certification charges of up to a maximum of \$50 with regard to any item which has been certified not to be authentic by an independent authority chosen by Christie's.

Any lot certified as not authentic pursuant to the above procedure may be returned to Christie's.

- 10. No lot may be taken away during the times of sale, nor can any lot be taken away unless the purchase price thereof has first been paid in full. All lots are to be paid for and taken away at the buyer's expense within three business days from sale. Buyers will be charged a late charge of 1½% per month on the total purchase price if payment in full is not received by Christie's in accordance with these Conditions of Sale. After payment has been made in full, Christie's will, as a service to buyers, arrange to have property packed, insured and forwarded at the request and expense of the buyer.
- 11. No lots may be returned to Christie's except in accordance with paragraphs 8 and 9 above.
- 12. Bids which are submitted to Christie's in writing or are otherwise left with Christie's prior to an auction ("Order Bids") for execution at or below a specified price shall be entertained and executed by Christie's for the convenience of bidders, but Christie's shall not be responsible for failing to execute such bids or for errors relating to its execution of such bids.
- 13. The buyer shall at the time the purchase price is paid pay any state and local sales tax and/or any compensating use tax which Christie's, in its sole judgement, determines to be applicable and which Christie's is required to collect.
- 14. If any conditions contained herein are not complied with by the buyer, Christie's may, in addition to asserting all remedies available by law, including the right to hold such defaulting buyer liable for the purchase price, either (i) cancel the sale, retaining as liquidated damages any payment made by the buyer, (ii) resell the property without reserve at public auction or privately on seven days' notice to the buyer, or (iii) take such other actions as it deems necessary or appropriate. If Christie's resells the property, the original defaulting buyer shall be liable for the payment of any deficiency in the purchase price and all costs and expenses, including the expenses of both sales, reasonable attorney's fees, commissions, incidental damages and all other charges due hereunder. Any buyer who fails to comply with the conditions contained herein will be deemed to have granted Christie's a security interest in any property owned by such buyer that is in Christie's possession. Christie's shall have the benefit of all rights of a secured party under the Uniform Commercial Code adopted in the state where the auction is held.
- 15. The respective rights and obligations of the parties with respect to the Conditions of Sale and the conduct of the auction shall be governed and interpreted by the laws of the state in which the auction is held. By bidding at an auction, whether present in person or by agent, by written bid, telephone or other means, the buyer shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the courts of such state and the federal courts sitting in such state.

### Information for Prospective Buyers

### Buyer's Premium and Sales Tax

Bidders are reminded that the final purchase price to be paid by the highest bidder shall be the aggregate of the final bid plus the buyer's premium in accordance with the provisions of Condition 5 of the Conditions of Sale. In addition, buyers are required to pay any sales or use tax which may be due, as described in Condition 13 of the Conditions of Sale. Buyers taking delivery in the following states must pay the applicable state and local sales or uses taxes at the same time of payment of the purchase price: California, Florida, Illinois, Massachusetts, New York, Pennsylvania, Texas and Washington, D.C.

### Seller's Reserve

All lots marked with • next to the lot number are offered subject to a reserve, which is the minimum price agreed to with the seller below which the lot will not be sold ("seller's reserve"). Christie's shall act to protect the seller's reserve as agent of the seller by bidding through the auctioneer. If bidding does not reach the seller's reserve on any lot, such lot will be withdrawn from the auction by the auctioneer.

### Christie's Role as Agent

Christie's accepts the consignment of property for sale at public auction solely in the capacity of agent for the seller. On occasion Christie's may advance funds to sellers against property consigned for sale. On rare occasions lots are offered which have in the course of the sale process become the property of Christie's. Such lots are identified with the symbol • placed next to the lot number.

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- (i) Advice to Bidders—Christie's staff of specialists is available to advise prospective buyers at all pre-sale exhibitions or by appointment.
- (ii) **Price Range Estimates**—Christie's publishes with each catalogue the opinion of its specialists as to the estimated price range for each lot. These estimates are the approximate prices expected to be realized at auction. They are not definitive. They are prepared well in advance of the sale and are subject to revision.
- (iii) Order Bids—Where bidders are unable to attend the sale, Christie's will be pleased to enter their bids without charge. If successful, the purchase price payable by the bidder will be the aggregate of the final bid and a premium of 10% of the final bid. In addition, buyers are required to pay any sales or use tax which may be due. Order Bids should always be made or confirmed in writing or by telegram or telex, reference being made to each sale through the code number printed on the title page of each catalogue. Such bids will be executed at the lowest possible price taking into account the reserve price and other bids and in accordance with the provisions of Condition 11 of the Conditions of Sale. If matching bids have been entered by two or more parties, the earliest bid shall take preference.

(iv) Shipment of Lots—As a service to buyers, Christie's will arrange to have lots packed, insured and mailed at the request, expense and risk of the buyer. Specific mailing instructions should be provided on the order bid form, or on the invoice copy accompanying payment. Christie's shall have complete discretion in determining the safest and most cost-effective means of shipment. However, the following guidelines will generally be used in sending lots to domestic buyers: purchases amounting to \$300 or less will be sent by first-class insured mail; from \$300 to \$25,000 by registered insured mail; above \$25,000 and for all mail to foreign countries by registered mail with insurance provided by Christie's at the buyer's expense. Large packages may be sent by U.P.S. or other carrier services.

### Successful Bids

Christie's will record the name or paddle number of the successful bidder upon the fall of the hammer, and may require such bidder to sign a bid confirmation slip. Successful order bidders shall be notified by invoice mailed immediately after the sale. Upon payment of the purchase price, the successful bidder is required to remove the property from Christie's in accordance with the provisions of Condition 6 of the Conditions of Sale. To insure that delivery is not delayed, intending bidders are encouraged to supply bank or other suitable references to Christie's prior to the auction.

### **Extension for Certification**

Prospective buyers may request certification of authenticity by an independent authority chosen by Christie's prior to or on the date of the auction in accordance with Condition 9 of the Conditions of Sale. In the case of United States stamps, the accepted authority is The Philatelic Foundation of New York.

### **Bidding Intervals**

The following bidding intervals will be used subject to the auctioneer's full discretion. Bids that do not conform with these intervals will be reduced appropriately unless requested otherwise:

### Prices Realized

unused with original gum significantly disturbed or heavily hinged

never hinged

original gum as issued by the post office

COVERS: should be expected to have minor nicks and tears usually from opening. Folded letters or covers normally have one or two file folds. These are not described unless of an exceptional nature and are not grounds for return.

folded letter

complete as sent with comments still attached to the outer address portion

folded cover

the outer portion of a folded letter but without contents

cover

an envelope

GRADES: The following terms are used to grade centering for United States stamps, both perforated and imperforate.

extremely fine

near perfect centering, reserved for the most exceptional examples

very fine

well-centered, satisfies the requirements of most particular collectors

fine

design intact although perforations or margins may touch the design on some issues

very good

perforation slightly in on one or two sides

good

off-centered or fairly attractive with slight defects

The application of these terms to stamped covers is meant to convey the overall condition and appearance of a particular item, rather than the grade of the stamp or stamps. With respect to stampless covers, the clarity of the markings is the basis for grading.

#### INTRODUCTION

The D. Scott Gallagher collection of Tennessee Postal History is a comprehensive study of this border state's role in the Civil War. It covers the period immediately preceding the formation of the Confederate government in 1861 through the post-war reconstruction. The emphasis is on Tennessee's postal system as an Independent State and Confederate State, and the showing of relevant postal history items is unrivalled in philately, in as much as several unique pieces are included.

On June 8, 1861, the citizens of Tennessee voted to secede from the United States. About two weeks later, on June 24, the move to secede was confirmed by Governor Harris and the General Assembly. Shortly after, on July 3, Tennessee officially became part of the Confederate States. During the period of unconfirmed Confederate status, Tennessee's postal system was in a confused state. Some postmasters, who felt obliged to enforce Federal regulations, continued to charge the Union rates of postage. Others, whose sentiments were strongly pro-Confederacy, were quick to adopt the new postage rates established on June 1 with the formation of the Confederate postal system.

Similar to other Confederate States, the cities and towns of Tennessee were forced to issue provisional means of prepaying postage before the first general postage issue arrived and during shortages of stamps. The issued adhesive stamps and provisionally-marked stationery form a fascinating and extremely valuable segment of this state's postal history. The Gallagher provisionals are the finest lot of Tennessee to appear on the market since the 1967 Lilly sale, and prior to that, the famous 1956 Caspary sale. Included are such well-known rarities as the Knoxville Ten-cent Green, which is the only known cover bearing this stamp, the Memphis Two-cent on cover, the Nashville Five-cent Carmine tête-bêche pair on cover, Five-cent Gray pair on cover, matching Five-cent and Ten-cent Nashville Express covers, and the unique Rheatown cover with the adhesive tied by the town postmark. Every one of these items was a highlight of the collections they previously graced, and, together, they form an incomparable showing of Tennessee provisionals.

Collectors should not allow their enthusiasm for the well-known provisional rarities distract their attention away from the lesser known, but comparably rare, handstamped 'Paids', 'Dues' and town markings. The offering that follows includes numerous listing items, finest known examples, and several unique pieces. The Memphis 'Due 2' drop letter handstamp, Lebanon 'Paid 4' newspaper rate, and previously unrecorded Shelbyville drop letter are certain to excite bidders as much as a provisional stamped cover.

The Tennessee specialist and the general Confederate collector will take equal interest in this offering. Historic and 'key' dates of usage will be found throughout the sale, and among the general issues are patriotic covers, railroad usages, and the only 'complete set' of Confederate general issue stamps used from Tennessee. This great achievement is highlighted by the only known four-frameline stamp on cover from Tennessee, and the only recorded Twenty-cent Green on cover from Tennessee.

Even collectors of Union usages have reason to examine this sale carefully. The prisoner-of-war and flag-of-truce section contains a number of important covers. Among the Union patriotics used from Tennessee are scarce occupation usages and a Nashville patriotic usage to Germany, franked with the U.S. 1861 30c Orange.

The last items worthy of special mention are the few non-Tennessee covers that D. Scott Gallagher asked to be included in this offering. The highlight of these lots is the finest known Ten-cent 'Frameline' stamp on cover. This magnificent cover is widely regarded as one of the outstanding Confederate general issue items in existence, and its inclusion in this sale is a fortunate exception.

This famous Confederate provisional stamp was discovered by Walbridge in 1886. It then passed to Messr. Smith, Hoyt, and finally into the major collection of Count Phillippe la Renotiére von Ferrari. The cover was sold as lot 11 in the June 15-16, 1922 Gilbert auction of Ferrari's collection. It then realized 6,200 francs plus the 171/2% government surtax, for a total of approximately \$650. By comparison, the Grove Hill, Alabama provisional cover in the same sale sold for approximately \$735 (it now catalogs at \$35,000). The next public offering of the Knoxville Ten-cent cover took place in March 1956 at the Caspary sale held by H. R. Harmer (lot 167, \$2,900). The cover later became part of the Josiah K. Lilly collection, selling at the Robert A. Siegel April 1967 auction as lot 324 for \$8,500.

Although this cover has no relevance to the Tennessee collection, it is offered in the sale as an important part of D. Scott Gallagher's collection. After searching through major Confederate sales of the past sixty years, it can be said with reasonable certainty that this example of the Ten-cent Frameline stamp is the finest existing on or off cover. To produce a copy of such dimensions required the destruction of framelines from eight surrounding stamps. That its creation should be followed by the Blakely postal clerk's careful cancellation, then preserved in almost perfect condition, is an incalculably rare sequence of events.



The use of the Twenty-cent general issue stamp in Tennessee was probably limited to one or two major cities left in Confederate hands by mid-1863 when the stamp was released. Greenville, one of the last cities to fall in Confederate Tennessee, had more of the general issues than any other post office; therefore, it is logical that this cover should originate at Greenville. According to Dr. Thomas Ray, this cover is the only known Twenty-cent usage from Tennessee.

## ARMY OF TENNESSEE

#### THE CHATTANOOGA 'ROVING' HANDSTAMP

This episode of Tennessee postal history is especially interesting. The large circular datestamp used at Chattanooga was taken with postmaster Harvey T. Phillips when Confederate forces evacuated the city on September 8, 1863. Phillips maintained a temporary post office behind Confederate lines to serve the Army of Tennessee, first at Chicamauga Station, then at Dalton, Georgia. All of this time, he continued to use the Chattanooga datestamp, and collectors have since named it the 'roving' postmark. The following section of Chattanooga covers traces this sequence of events in chronological order.






