Conditions of Sale for Stamps

The property described in this catalogue, which description may be amended by sale room notice or announcement, will be offered for sale by Christie, Manson & Woods International, Inc. ("Christie's"), as agent for various owners or other consignors ("sellers").

These Conditions of Sale set forth below constitute the complete terms and exclusive statement of the conditions on which all such property is offered for sale. Christie's reserves the right to vary the terms of sale. By bidding at auction, whether present in person or by agent, by written bid, telephone or other means, the buyer agrees to be bound by these Conditions of Sale.

- 1. As used in these Conditions of Sale, the term "the final bid" means the highest bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, and the term "the purchase price" means the sum of the final bid and the premium payable by the buyer under Condition 4.
- 2. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer of the lot offered for sale, subject to the terms set forth in these Conditions of Sale. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his absolute discretion, and, in the event of any dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. Should there be any dispute after the sale, Christie's record of final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. Christie's reserves the right to withdraw any lot before or at the sale.
- 4. The purchase price payable by a buyer shall be the sum of the final bid and a premium of 10% of the final bid.
- 5. All lots marked with next to the lot number are offered subject to a reserve, which is the confidential minimum price agreed to with the seller below which the lot will not be sold ("seller's reserve"). Christic's shall act to protect the seller's reserve as agent of the seller by bidding through the auctioneer. The auctioneer may open the bidding on any lot below the reserve by placing a bid on behalf of the seller. The auctioneer may continue to bid on behalf of the seller up to the amount of the reserve, either by placing consecutive bids or by placing bids in response to other bidders.
- 6. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer may be required to (i) sign a confirmation of purchase, (ii) supply his name and address, (iii) pay the full purchase price or such part thereof as Christie's in its sole discretion, shall require, and (iv) comply with such other conditions as may be applicable. If the buyer fails to comply with any such requirement, the lot may, at the auctioneer's discretion, be reoffered for sale. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the seller.
- 7. All lots are sold as authentic and correctly described (unless the catalogue descriptions or sale room notices or announcements provide otherwise, in which case lots are sold "as is").
- 8. Except for lots which contain five or more stamps, any lot which in Christie's judgement is incorrectly described may be returned to Christie's within two weeks of the date of the auction, whereupon Christie's will refund all payments made with regard to such lot. Seller and Christie's shall not have any other liability arising from the sale of such lot and shall not be liable for any incidental or consequential damages arising from the sale thereof.
- 9. The following conditions apply to requests by bidders for certifications of authenticity:
- Bidders must advise Christie's in writing prior to or on the date of the auction as to all items with respect to which a certificate of authenticity is desired;
- (ii) Christie's will submit all such items to an independent authority chosen by Christie's for certification;

(iii) Except with respect to items certified as not authentic, buyers of certified items must pay as part of the purchase price all charges for certification, including postage, mail registration and handling;

(iv) Buyers of items to be certified must make payment in full immediately upon purchase in accordance with paragraphs 6 and 10 hereof. Christie's will refund certification charges of up to a maximum of \$50 with regard to any item which has been certified not to be authentic by an independent authority chosen by Christie's.

Any lot certified as not authentic pursuant to the above procedure may be returned to Christie's.

- 10. No lot may be taken away during the times of sale, nor can any lot be taken away unless the purchase price thereof has first been paid in full. All lots are to be paid for and taken away at the buyer's expense within three business days from sale. Buyers will be charged a late charge of 1½% per month on the total purchase price if payment in full is not received by Christie's in accordance with these Conditions of Sale. After payment has been made in full, Christie's will, as a service to buyers, arrange to have property packed, insured and forwarded at the request and expense of the buyer.
- 11. No lots may be returned to Christie's except in accordance with paragraphs 8 and 9 above.
- 12. Bids which are submitted to Christie's in writing or are otherwise left with Christie's prior to an auction ("Order Bids") for execution at or below a specified price shall be entertained and executed by Christie's for the convenience of bidders, but Christie's shall not be responsible for failing to execute such bids or for errors relating to its execution of such bids.
- 13. The buyer shall at the time the purchase price is paid pay any state and local sales tax and/or any compensating use tax which Christie's, in its sole judgement, determines to be applicable and which Christie's is required to collect.
- 14. If any conditions contained herein are not complied with by the buyer, Christie's may, in addition to asserting all remedies available by law, including the right to hold such defaulting buyer liable for the purchase price, either (i) cancel the sale, retaining as liquidated damages any payment made by the buyer, (ii) resell the property without reserve at public auction or privately on seven days' notice to the buyer, or (iii) take such other actions as it deems necessary or appropriate. If Christie's resells the property, the original defaulting buyer shall be liable for the payment of any deficiency in the purchase price and all costs and expenses, including the expenses of both sales, reasonable attorney's fees, commissions, incidental damages and all other charges due hereunder. Any buyer who fails to comply with the conditions contained herein will be deemed to have granted Christie's a security interest in any property owned by such buyer that is in Christie's possession. Christie's shall have the benefit of all rights of a secured party under the Uniform Commercial Code adopted in the state where the auction is held.
- 15. The respective rights and obligations of the parties with respect to the Conditions of Sale and the conduct of the auction shall be governed and interpreted by the laws of the state in which the auction is held. By bidding at an auction, whether present in person or by agent, by written bid, telephone or other means, the buyer shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the courts of such state and the federal courts sitting in such state.

Information for Prospective Buyers

Buyer's Premium and Sales Tax

Bidders are reminded that the final purchase price to be paid by the highest bidder shall be the aggregate of the final bid plus the buyer's premium in accordance with the provisions of Condition 5 of the Conditions of Sale. In addition, buyers are required to pay any sales or use tax which may be due, as described in Condition 13 of the Conditions of Sale. Buyers taking delivery in the following states must pay the applicable state and local sales or uses taxes at the same time of payment of the purchase price: California, Florida, Illinois, Louisiana, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Texas and Washington, D.C.

Seller's Reserve

All lots marked with • next to the lot number are offered subject to a reserve, which is the minimum price agreed to with the seller below which the lot will not be sold ("seller's reserve"). Christie's shall act to protect the seller's reserve as agent of the seller by bidding through the auctioneer. If bidding does not reach the seller's reserve on any lot, such lot will be withdrawn from the auction by the auctioneer.

Christie's Role as Agent

Christie's accepts the consignment of property for sale at public auction solely in the capacity of agent for the seller. On occasion Christie's may advance funds to sellers against property consigned for sale. On rare occasions lots are offered which have in the course of the sale process become the property of Christie's. Such lots are identified with the symbol ϕ placed next to the lot number.

Services

Christie's provides prospective buyers with the following services:

- (i) Advice to Bidders—Christie's staff of specialists is available to advise prospective buyers at all pre-sale exhibitions or by appointment.
- (ii) **Price Range Estimates**—Christie's publishes with each catalogue the opinion of its specialists as to the estimated price range for each lot. These estimates are the approximate prices expected to be realized at auction. They are not definitive. They are prepared well in advance of the sale and are subject to revision.
- (iii) Order Bids—Where bidders are unable to attend the sale, Christie's will be pleased to enter their bids without charge. If successful, the purchase price payable by the bidder will be the aggregate of the final bid and a premium of 10% of the final bid. In addition, buyers are required to pay any sales or use tax which may be due. Order Bids should always be made or confirmed in writing or by telegram or telex, reference being made to each sale through the code number printed on the title page of each catalogue. Such bids will be executed at the lowest possible price taking into account the reserve price and other bids and in accordance with the provisions of Condition 12 of the Conditions of Sale. If matching bids have been entered by two or more parties, the earliest bid shall take preference.

(iv) **Shipment of Lots**—As a service to buyers, Christie's will arrange to have lots packed, insured and mailed at the request, expense and risk of the buyer. Specific mailing instructions should be provided on the order bid form, or on the invoice copy accompanying payment. Christie's shall have complete discretion in determining the safest and most cost-effective means of shipment. However, the following guidelines will generally be used in sending lots to domestic buyers: purchases amounting to \$300 or less will be sent by first-class insured mail; from \$300 to \$25,000 by registered insured mail; above \$25,000 and for all mail to foreign countries by registered mail with insurance provided by Christie's at the buyer's expense. Large packages may be sent by U.P.S. or other carrier services.

Successful Bids

Christiè's will record the name or paddle number of the successful bidder upon the fall of the hammer, and may require such bidder to sign a bid confirmation slip. Successful order bidders shall be notified by invoice mailed immediately after the sale. Upon payment of the purchase price, the successful bidder is required to remove the property from Christie's in accordance with the provisions of Condition 10 of the Conditions of Sale. To insure that delivery is not delayed, intending bidders are encouraged to supply bank or other suitable references to Christie's prior to the auction.

Extension for Certification

Prospective buyers may request certification of authenticity by an independent authority chosen by Christie's prior to or on the date of the auction in accordance with Condition 9 of the Conditions of Sale. In the case of United States stamps, the accepted authority is The Philatelic Foundation of New York.

Bidding Intervals

The following bidding intervals will be used subject to the auctioneer's full discretion. Bids that do not conform with these intervals will be reduced appropriately unless requested otherwise:

Prices Realized

The list of prices realized at the auction will be published shortly after the sale and will be available upon request. Where lots are withdrawn from sale or fail to reach the reserve price, the lot number will not be printed in the published list. Prices realized on any such "bought in" lot that is sold within 24 hours of the auction may be included on the list of prices realized but will be marked to indicate that such prices were not realized at the auction.

Notes Concerning Descriptions

GUM: Original gum is not to be expected on Nineteenth Century Issues unless so stated in the description. Original gum should be expected on Twentieth Century Issues unless stated otherwise in the description.

o.g.

unused with original gum showing slight disturbance caused by previous hinge, which may be

present in part or entirely removed

hinge mark

original gum showing evidence of hinge removal, including but not limited to redistributed

gum in the area of hinging

part o.g.

unused with original gum significantly disturbed or heavily hinged

never hinged

original gum as issued by the post office

COVERS: should be expected to have minor nicks and tears usually from opening. Folded letters or covers normally have one or two file folds. These are not described unless of an exceptional nature and are not grounds for return.

folded letter

complete as sent with comments still attached to the outer address portion

folded cover

the outer portion of a folded letter but without contents

cover

an envelope

GRADES: The following terms are used to grade centering for United States stamps, both perforated and imperforate.

extremely fine

near perfect centering, reserved for the most exceptional examples well-centered, satisfies the requirements of most particular collectors

very fine fine

design intact although perforations or margins may touch the design on some issues

very good

perforation slightly in on one or two sides

good

off-centered or fairly attractive with slight defects

The application of these terms to stamped covers is meant to convey the overall condition and appearance of a particular item, rather than the grade of the stamp or stamps. With respect to stampless covers, the clarity of the markings is the basis for grading.

A dispatch dated June 24, 1861, directed the Louisville postmaster, J. J. Speed, to treat letters from the South as unpaid and to send foreign-bound letters directly to the Dead Letter Office in Washington D.C. For unknown reasons, some letters were sent to New York for posting overseas instead of to the Dead Letter Office. These were marked 'Southn. Letter Unpaid' at Louisville and treated as unpaid letters in transit. There are four recorded examples of the U.S. 1857 stamps used on overseas mail with the 'Southn. Letter Unpaid' marking: two to France with 3c and 12c stamps, one to Germany with three 10c stamps (ex Grunin, Part One, Christie's sale, Mar. 25, 1987, \$55,000) and the 24c cover to England.

The three recorded examples of the 10c Baton Rouge provisional are offered in this sale. The unique cover travelled from London dealer, Thomas Ridpath (known in association with the British Guiana 1c Black on magenta), to Alfred H. Caspary. Where Ridpath acquired the 10c Baton Rouge is not known. After Caspary's death, his two copies of this rarity were sold on March 5, 1956, the cover realizing \$1,400. The Caspary auction was the last public offering of the 10c Baton Rouge cover. Since then, the cover has been part of the Lightner and Freeland collection, with the Weills handling the sales and purchases of both these major collections.



Beaumont issued provisionals typset in two different sizes. The smaller size is found on yellow and pink paper. Of the large size with ornaments, there is the one recorded copy offered in this sale. This unique item was found by a Texas collector, Fred Green, among the Duncan correspondence which he purchased intact. The large Beaumont was bought by George Walcott, who in turn sold it to Charles Phillips. It passed into the Alfred H. Caspary collection and was sold after his death in the March 5, 1956 sale of Confederate States provisionals for \$2,000. The cover became part of the Camille Lightner collection, which was purchased privately by the Weills. The cover was later sold to Josiah K. Lilly and realized \$9,000 at the April 27, 1967 sale of his Confederate provisionals, returning to the Weills. For a period of years it was owned by the Rev. Paul Freeland, whose important Confederate States collection was acquired privately by the Weills.



The Livingston provisional is one of three Confederate provisional designs to incorporate human figures into a pictorial design; the others are the Mobile, Alabama, 2c and 5c stamps of the same style and probably printed by the same lithographer, and the Danville, Virginia, printed entires.

According to published records and unpublished sources, this is the earliest use and only existing pair of the Livingston provisional stamp. A total of eleven Livingston stamps are recorded, including this pair on cover, six singles on individual covers, and three off-cover singles.

The pair on cover was first sold at public auction in the Ferrary sale on June 14, 1922, where it was bought by Warren Colson for the equivalent of \$2,950. Colson was presumably acting on behalf of Alfred H. Caspary, who owned the Livingston pair until his death. At the magnificent Caspary Confederate States provisionals sale in 1956, the Livingston pair was bought by the Weills for \$14,000, which established a record price for any Confederate item sold at auction up to that time. The cover became part of the Camille Lightner collection, which was bought privately by the Weills, and then passed into the Josiah K. Lilly collection. After Lilly's death, it was sold in 1967 at auction for \$19,000, to the Weills again. John R. Boker, Jr. acquired the cover for his important collection of Confederate States provisionals, and, when his collection was dispersed privately in 1981, the Livingston pair became the property of a European. It was offered in Christie's auction of June 18, 1985 and realized \$176,000, which still remains as the highest price ever achieved at auction for a Confederate States item. The buyers were the Weills.

POSTAGE ON NEWSPAPERS, PERIODICALS, BOOKS, &c.

An Act to prescribe the Rates of Postage on Newspapers, Periodicals, Books and transient and other matter, and to repeat, in part, the second section of the Act approved May the thirteenth, eighteen hundred and sixty-one; to amend "An Act to prescribe the Rates of Postage in the Confederate States of America, and for other purposes," approved February the twenty-third, eighteen hundred and sixty-one.

twenty-third, eighteen hundred and sixty-one.

The Congress of the Confederate States of America do enact, That the rates of inland postage on newspapers, published in the Confederate States, and sent to regular subscribers, shall be at the rate of one cent for each paper not weighing more than three ounces, and for every additional ounce, or fraction of an ounce, one-half cent additional shall be charged on each paper; and periodicals published oftener than semi-monthly shall be charged as newspapers. The inland postage on other periodicals, published in the Confederate States, and sent to actual subscribers, shall be, on the regular numbers of a periodical, not exceeding one and a half ounces in weight, one cent on each number, and one cent additional on each additional ounce or fraction of an ounce. Regular subscribers to newspapers and periodicals shall be required to pay the postage thereon quarterly in advance, at the office of delivery, unless paid at the post office of the place of publication. The inland postage on every other newspaper, and on each circular not sealed, handbill, engraving, pamphlet, periodical, magazine, or other paper, which shall be unconnected with any maguscript or written matter, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, shall be one cent, and for every additional onnee or fraction of an ounce, one cent additional; and books, bound and unbound, not weighing over four pounds, shall be deemed mailable matter, and the inland postage on them shall be at the rate of two cents an ounce or fraction of an ounce, and the postage on all such transient matter and books shall be preparable in all cases except when sent by officers, musicians or privates of the army, as provided for in the act of July 26th, 1861, relating to the prepayment of postage in every additional, or any other unsealed printed transient matter, placed in any post office, not for transmission, but for delivery only, the postage shall be one cent.

SEC 2. That this act shall take effect and be in force, on and after the las


When the subscription to a newspaper or periodical does not commence with the beginning of the fiscal quarter of the Department, payment of postage in advance shall only be required for the fraction of such quarter.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ROUTE AGENTS.

Route Agents are directed to use all proper diligence in preventing newspaper dealers and news boys from conveying and selling newspapers or periodicals along the mail routes, unless the postage has been prepaid at the post office nearest the place of publication or purchase thereof, which prepayment shall be indicated by the stamp of such post office, or by writing, upon each paper so sent; and to report to this Department all cases of the kind that come to their knowledge. To detect any violations of this law they should, at proper times, close their mail cars, and pass through the trains.

The conveyance of letters, or other mailable matter, by express or other companies, their agents or employees, is forbidden by law, and Route Agents are directed to report to this Department every case

of violation of the law coming under their observation.
