The Pleasant Shade Provisional

The Pleasant Shade provisional is similar to that of Petersburg, Virginia. They were printed from the same settings as the Petersburg provisional. To make the Pleasant Shade provisionals the printer made several changes to the settings used for the Petersburg stamp. The town name was changed at the top and "Virginia" was changed from all capitals to upper-and lower-case letters. The ornaments on both sides of "Virginia" were also removed and the name of the postmaster was changed at the bottom. Several other minor alterations were made.

The form for printing the Pleasant Shade provisionals consisted of five settings or positions. The printer was A. F. Crutchfield & Co., of Petersburg. This firm also published the *Petersburg Daily Express*.

Brief History

The Pleasant Shade provisional was first chronicled in the 20 March 1870 edition of the *American Journal of Philately* (page 33). The article notes that the stamp was first described in a paper read by Mr. [Charles] Watson before the New York Philatelic Society in June 1868. The minutes of the meeting do not mention the Pleasant Shade provisional, only that Watson read a paper on the Confederate postal service. The Pleasant Shade provisional was first cataloged in the 19th edition of John W. Scotts' *Descriptive Price List of Used and Unused Postage Stamps*, in May 1870.

Fakes



The fake above is identified by the letters in the postmaster's name at the bottom being both out of alignment and high. This fake is attributed to Petrie.





The *Postage Stamp Reporter* for October 1872 (page 5) contained an ad by Arthur H. Wheeler of Lowell, Massachusetts. The ad illustrated and stated facsimiles of the Pleasant Shade stamp were now available. The identifying characteristics of this fake are the town name spelled as one word and the final "E" being slightly raised above the base line of the other letters. Two examples of this "facsimile" are illustrated at above. The left example is in the correct blue color and the example at right is printed in red.

After Caspary Sale

It is difficult to properly identify specific unused stamps as sometimes they are trimmed, and other times cut from blocks. A good example is seen in the illustrations above showing how the appearance of CN-010 changed due to trimming.
