The story of the discovery of the Isabella provisional is chronicled in the article listed in the "Reference" below. When the cover was first submitted for authentication it received a certificate that it was a stampless use. This was because no other like example was known. In the late 1990s a committee reviewing candidates for provisional status concluded it was a provisional and it has been listed as such in catalogs ever since.
