## **The Lexington Provisionals**

The Lexington provisionals were prepared by handstamping envelopes with a town postmark that was specially prepared to render "PAID / 5" and "PAID / 10" markings. These same markings were used on stampless cover so the markings are only considered provisionals when postally unused, under a postally used general issue, or mailed from another town. See **Notes** for more information.

The CSA Catalog lists both markings in blue. However, the only recorded example of the "PAID / 10" marking is in black.

**NOTE**: The inclusion of an item in this census is not a guarantee of authenticity.



## **History**

Lexington stampless covers have been know for some time, but until the 1980s were never considered provisionals. In 1984 a theory was advanced that there was a difference between Lexington stampless markings and provisional markings (Powell and Kaufmann – References). The basic tenet was that to be a provisional the office canceller had to be struck within 3/4 of an inch of the partial circle of the "PAID / 5" or "PAID / 10" marking. Although this theory was accepted initially, now only Lexington stampless covers without postmarks are considered provisionals.

### **Provisional or Not?**

The cover below appears to meet the criteria for a provisional use as it is not postmarked. However, there is a "Way" marking at upper center. This indicates the cover was picked up between towns by the mail carrier and dropped off at the first post office he reached. Was this office Lexington? Was the "PAID / 5" marking already on the cover (provisional) or was it added to indicate the payment of postage (stampless use)? Why no postmark as the letter had entered the mail system as evidenced by the "Way" marking. This cover is included in the census.



## **Specially Prepared Markings**

The marking below shows evidence of the town name inside the rim at top. This indicates the postmaster either used a type that was higher than the rest of the postmark or placed something under the type, so the paid marking was all that made an impression on the envelope. The partial rim resulted from the marking being struck at a slight angle, so part of the rim struck the envelope.


