Goliad Provisionals

The Goliad provisionals were printed at the office of *The Messenger*, the local newspaper. They were typeset and printed on white, gray, rose and dark blue paper. Some examples also have a blue wash that was added after printing.

Two different settings were made. The first has town name in italics (Type A). In the second setting the town name is in Roman letters and the postmaster's name, J. A. Clarke and the word "POSTAGE" were added (Type B). The same settings were used for both the 5 and 10 cent values.

In one position on the second setting (Type B) an error was made in spelling "GOLIAD" resulting in the "GOILAD" error. This error is found in both values.

It is believed the first setting (Type A) was prepared between June 1861 and June 1862. The second setting (Type B) was probably prepared between 1863 and 1864 and used until the end of the war.

NOTE: Every effort is made to ensure the accuracy of the census, but the inclusion of an item is not a guarantee of authenticity.

Notes

What is it?

The cover illustrated below (A05, CN-007) deserves some study. There is no legible origin postmark, but we know the cover was originally addressed to Columbia, Texas. It was apparently missent to Columbus, Texas as evidenced by that town's the postmark at bottom.

At one time there was a stamp in the upper right corner. Now there is only the Goliad provisional to the left of the missing stamp. The postmark rim does not tie the provisional and this is verified by the image from the Hind sale and close up of the stamp obtained using Postmark Reveal. If the stamp originated on the cover the rim of the postmark should be seen on the stamp. No trace of a postmark rim is visible. What is visible is an "X" pen cancel that is common on some Goliad provisionals. While the provisional is authentic its use on this cover is questionable. The cover is included in the census.







Buff Paper?

The cover below (A08, CN-003) was discovered in 1988 by Charles F. Deaton. It was subsequently sold in the sale of the Camina collection by Robert A. Siegel Auctions in 1994. In that auction the description stated the provisional of this type is "found on several shades of gray paper; the paper of this example has an unusual buff tint."

The cover next came on the market in the sale of the Peter Sharrer collection in 2012. The description noted:

The stamp on this cover is certified as the normal 29X7 on Gray paper, and it has always been described in accordance with the Scott listing. However, as the comparison photograph shows (below), this stamp and the Gray 29X7 stamp (lot 28) are on two different colored papers. This stamp is more accurately described as Buff. It is known that the Goliad Messenger newspaper office used whatever paper they could find, including salvaged paper from other print runs. Therefore, it is quite conceivable that papers of different colors were used for the Goliad printings.
