Report of the Jury

The Jury of EuroPhilEx Birmingham 2025, an exhibition under the Philatelic Patronage of the Federation of European Philatelic Associations ("FEPA") and with recognition from the Fédération Internationale de Philatélie ("FIP"), has completed its judging and is pleased to present its report.

The Jury judged a total of 304 exhibits and 120 items of literature and is happy to report that the quality of the exhibits shown was very high. A total of 43 Large Gold Medals and 85 Gold Medals was awarded and it is particularly pleasing to report that many exhibits have made significant improvements since they were last shown in previous stamp exhibitions.

6 exhibits were transferred to a different class to the one in which they were entered in order enable them to receive better awards. Unfortunately, 33 exhibits (including literature) did not arrive and therefore could not be judged.

The Jury would like to offer their thanks to the Organising Committee of EuroPhilEx Birmingham 2025, the FEPA Consultant, the FIP Representative, and the National Commissioners for their efficiency and hard work. We are also grateful to those who provided invited exhibits shown in the Court of Honour. These have created considerable interest among visitors to the exhibition.

Finally, we would like to offer thanks all of the EuroPhilEx Birmingham 2025 volunteers for their loyalty and friendship and to the Organising Committee for the facilities and support provided.

Report of the Expert Team

The Expert Group of Europhilex 2025 inspected all the exhibits in each competitive class and dubious items found by its members or reported by the Team Leaders of the International Jury were checked.

In addition, all the exhibits "best in class" and candidates to the Grand Prix were carefully examined.

As a result, a total of 20 items were examined closer and the recommendations of the Expert Group were as follows:

No action required:	1 item
Has to be certified:	17 items
N/A required but improvement of the description	2 items

The Expert Group also made a specific review of those exhibits which had been queried at previous FIP exhibitions (including FIAP / FEPA / FIAF) where certificates or actions were required.

Out of 23 items identified, 8 had a certificate provided, 1 complied with the suggested action, 11 items were not exhibited, and 3 items were not provided with the requested certification.

Each single report together with the pictures shall be handed over to the respective exhibitors through their National Commissioners. Copies of all reports shall be forwarded to FIP and FEPA for follow up at later exhibitions.

Furthermore, to avoid any unpleasant downgrade the Expert Group strongly recommend to all National Commissioners the utmost care in consigning the reports to the exhibitors.

Finally, the Expert Group consisting of Mr. Giacomo Bottacchi (TL), Dr. Tim Harrison and Dr. Bruno Crevato-Selvaggi would like to thank the Judging teams for their cooperation so well as the Organizing Committee for the excellent facilities for the smooth working of our group.
