# CWPS ANNUAL MEETING REPORT

The 2025 CWPS Annual Meeting was held March 14-16 at the Garfield-Perry March Party in Cleveland, Ohio. Society members staffed a table at the show to provide visitors with information about the Society and encourage new memberships. The large bourse at the show was supported by seven CWPS member dealers offering a wide range of Civil War-related material.

### **Annual Membership Meeting**

President Dan Knowles welcomed the approximately 25 annual meeting attendees. Next, a moment of silence remembered those CWPS members who we lost in the past year. This was followed by the following annual reports:

**Treasurer Wayne Farley:** We remain financially sound. For the calendar year 2024, we recorded a net gain of \$3,222 on income vs. expenses. The full financial report can be found on page 44 of this issue.

**Secretary Dennis King:** Membership levels remained consistent with 484 current members. This was down three members from our reporting in March of 2024. We added 29 members in this reporting period, an increase of five from the previous year. In 2025, Richard L. Calhoun, Tony L. Crumbley, Ronald D. McVay and Fields L. Parks III achieved 50 years of continuous membership. Richard Calhoun and Tony Crumbley were presented with Society medals recognizing the long membership.

**Stefan Jaronski, Civil War Philatelic Authentication Service (CWPAS):** We had 36 total submissions in 2024 with 11 from members, four from non-members and two from auction houses. This was down from 46 total submissions in 2023, which had a large number of auction house submissions associated with major sales. The expenses and income recorded resulted in a small gain of \$365. Given this balance, we have no plans to change our pricing structure for this year.

Tim McRee Advertising Manager: Total Revenue for the CWP in 2024 was \$6,902. This was

down \$623 from the previous year. We continue to look for new advertising partners, as well as potential ad-swaps with complimentary publications.

Michael C. O'Reilly Grievance Committee: No grievance reports were filed during the last year.

Haydn Myer Award for distinguished service to the CWPS during the past 12 months:




